Faith Continuum goes into the month with the and and 3rd Sundays of Pastor Paul Meierding's 3 Sunday Series on "Jesus in the Movies". Information regarding this series is available as a handout in the Narthex.

We return to a look at the Islam Faith on Feb. 19th with a faith prospective from a practicing Muslim. Gustavus Physics Professor Dr. Steven Mellema will share his faith including his conversion to Islam while in the Peace Corps.

We begin the first Sunday of Lent with a return to Faith Continuum's inaugural study - "Roots of Our Faith". We commence this time of reflection with Dr. Darrell Jodock. He will lead a two Sunday Study of the Augsburg Confession. This may be the most thorough study of the "Articles" of the Lutheran Tradition you have undergone since your Confirmation days. Follow up topics on our "Roots" Lutheranism will be led by returning presenter Dr. Mark Tranvik and first time lecturer Dr. Leonard Hummel. Dr. Tranvik leads on the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper; and, Dr. Hummel closes with "Luther's Theology on Consolation for the Suffering" in both theory and practice.

## Sometimes We Need to Fast

To be powerful in prayer, we must be willing to withdraw from the world and devote ourselves to God. The world constantly encourages us to indulge and treat ourselves, but doing so draws our attention away from God and eventually separates us from God. Samson was a man set apart for God, but when he rebelled and broke his vows, God withdrew his presence and power, causing Samson to lose his great strength. [Judges 16:18-20]. Likewise, God withdraws his power from anyone who is more concerned with the world and its cares than with God.

There are many ways to separate from the world and focus on God, but the most immediate is fasting. Fasting means to abstain from or go without something, usually food. We can fast from one type of food or from all food, for one meal, one day, or several days. Jesus fasted, and implied that all of his followers would also fast. [Matthew 4:1-2; Matthew 6:16-18; Matthew 9:14-15]. Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote in his book, The Cost of Discipleship, "Jesus takes it for granted that His disciples will observe the pious custom of fasting. Strict exercise of self-control is an essential feature of the Christian life. Such customs have only one purpose - to make the disciples more ready and cheerful to accomplish those things which God would have done."

Fasting and prayer go hand in hand. When we pray, we tell God what we need and want. But when we pray and fast, we convey that the thing for which we pray is important to us, that we are focused on it, and that we are willing to sacrifice for it. If you have been praying for something for a long time but have seen no results, try adding fasting and see what happens. After fasting and prayer, many people report spiritual breakthrough, a closer relationship with God, and a greater level of self-discipline.

This year Ash Wednesday falls on February 22nd and marks the beginning of Lent, the 40 day period (excluding Sundays) prior to Easter. During this time, many Christians observe the Lenten "disciplines" of repentance, prayer, fasting and works of love. Lent is an excellent time to begin fasting, resume fasting, or continue fasting, as a way to draw closer to God. Give it a try and see what happens!

Yet even now, says the Lord, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing. Joel 2:12-13
