

# PRAYER CORNER

## MOSES PRAYS FOR GOD'S PRESENCE

Exodus 33:12-23

In this Prayer Corner, we are focusing specifically on prayers of the Old Testament and what they reveal about God's nature. This month, we will

examine Moses' prayer to God found in Exodus 33:12-23. There is not enough space to include the whole prayer here, but I encourage you to go to your Bible and read it. Remember, Moses was chosen by God to lead the Israelites out of Egypt and to the promised land. [Exodus 3:1-10]. On their way, God made a covenant with them whereby God promised to bless them if they obeyed God's laws. [Exodus 19:5]. Almost before the ink had dried on the covenant, the Israelites created a golden calf to worship, which broke the covenant and angered God. [Exodus 32:1-6].

Although Moses persuaded God to forgive them and allow them to continue to the promised land, God declined to go with them because they were

“a stiff-necked people.” [Exodus 33:3].

So Moses entered his “tent of meeting” to speak with the Lord. The Bible says, “the Lord used to speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend.” [Exodus 33:11]. Moses pleaded with God to continue on with the

people, saying, “If your presence will not go, do not carry us up from here. For how shall it be known that I have found favor in your sight, I and your people, unless you go with us?” [Exodus 33:15-16]. God agreed, saying, “I will do the very thing that you have asked; for you have found favor in my sight, and I know you by name.” [vs. 17]. Then Moses boldly asked God to reveal God's glory, a visible expression of God's presence.

[vs. 18]. Again God agreed, saying: “I will make all my goodness pass before you, and will proclaim before you the name ‘The Lord’; and I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will show mercy on whom I will show mercy.” [vs. 19]. And God's glory and presence did accompany Moses and the people on the rest of their journey. [See Exodus 40:34-38].

I am part of the Congregational Life Board. We plan activities for the adults of CTK to come together for fun and fellowship.

There are so many things we can learn from this prayer! Here are a few:

- First, God clearly wants to be in a relationship with us. Moses was a friend of God and spoke to God as a friend. They were on a first name basis. As a result of this close relationship, Moses found favor with God and was successful in persuading God to be gracious and merciful to the Israelites, even when they did not deserve it. This is such a beautiful model of how we, too, can approach God in prayer.
- Second, it is possible to experience the tangible manifestation of God's divine presence. Moses longed for this presence and saw no point in continuing his journey unless God's presence went with him. How often do we set out on our own, making plans and creating itineraries, without asking God to reveal his glory to us and to accompany us on this journey that is life?
- Third, in revealing his glory, God is really showing us his goodness. God told Moses, "I will make all my goodness pass before you." [Exodus 33:19]. In God's presence there is nothing but goodness, because that is God's nature. Numerous verses affirm the goodness of God: "Give thanks to the Lord for the Lord is good" can be found at least ten times in the Bible [See 1 Chronicles 16:34; 2 Chronicles 5:13 and 7:3; Ezra 3:11; Psalm 100:5, 106:1, 107:1, 118:1, 136:1; and Jeremiah 33:11], and there are many other references to God's goodness. Jesus said that no one is good but God alone. [Luke 18:19]. Let us remember and affirm that God is ALWAYS good—to us, and to all who seek him. [See Lamentations 3:25].

*"See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them." [Revelation 21:3]*




