












There will be NO community supper on May 24th, we are having a private dinner to recognize our Seniors.











#### **Kato Sleepout Update**

The Kato Sleepout in which I recently participated served two purposes: raise awareness regarding people experiencing homelessness, and as a fundraiser for Connections Shelter in Mankato. Thank you for helping me acquire my "you've been housed" card for the Kato Sleepout with your generous donations!









The Connections Shelter event was rescheduled to April 14th (due to a winter storm weather warning in March). The sleepout included time for learning about Connections Shelter and its drop-in center on Front Street. The evening included assimilation activities: having my backpack searched, finding a spot to camp in the parking lot; being served dinner; and playing a game, in which each player represented a real-life stories and scenarios in acquiring safe, affordable housing. The weather that evening swung from being hot and sunny to cold, rainy, and windy. It felt like an amazing blessing when Pastor Collette and Pastor Erica announced that the goal for the Sleepout had been surpassed and, as a result, every participant could go home. As I returned home that night, I found myself more mindful and grateful to have a place I call home. Thank you, CTK, for raising \$1367 of the over \$22,000 that was raised through the Kato Sleepout. We slept out, so others don't have to.

#### Find a Deserted Place

In this column, we have been examining lessons on prayer that Jesus taught us, either by his words or his example. One of the things Jesus seemed to do quite often was to withdraw from the crowds and his disciples, find a deserted place, and pray alone:

- And after [Jesus] had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone . . . ~Matthew 14:23
- In the morning, while it was still very dark, [Jesus] got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. ~Mark 1:35
- But [Jesus] would withdraw to deserted places and pray. ~Luke 5:16

There are many distractions in this life. It is almost overwhelming to consider how many things vie for our time and attention every day—work, school, family, friends, chores, gym, volunteer activities, news, social media feeds, and on and on. But interestingly, God is not on that list. God does not compete for our attention the way other things do.

Jesus put a priority on his relationship with God the Father. In order to clearly know and hear God, Jesus needed to withdraw from the world and spend time alone with God. If that was important for Jesus, it should also be important for us. God wants to have a relationship with us. God wants us to know who he is. When we spend time alone with God, we draw closer to him and get to know him in a more intimate way than is possible in a large group setting like a church service.

How can we establish a practice of giving God our full attention for a certain period of time each day? Jesus said, "whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret" (Matthew 6:6). Find a quiet spot in your home where you can shut the door on all distractions. Make it a habit to meet God there at the same time every day. Start with five minutes if that's all you have. That may soon grow to ten minutes, twenty minutes, even an hour, as you linger in God's presence and receive the peace that comes only from him. Tell God what is on your heart and mind, but also ask God what is on his heart and mind. Make it your priority to get to know God as well as you know your best friend!



# Meet the Cruz Family



The Cruz family came to Christ the King to worship with us April 16 and April 19. It was so nice to have the opportunity to meet them and talk to them with the assistance of Emma Norland's interpreting skills. To know them even better, please read the letter, below, that was signed by all the pastors of the five congregations that are represented by WELCOME. The members of the Welcome Team have come to know the Cruz family very well and were anxious to have a letter of support accompany them to their first ICE, Immigration and Customs Enforcement, appointment in February. Below is a copy of that letter:

February 13, 2023

U.S. Immigration & Naturalization Service Whipple Federal Building Fort Snelling, Minnesota

To Whom It May Concern,

We are writing this letter in full support and love for the Ariac and Andrea Cruz Family. This young family of four, formerly from Nicaragua, is very grateful to find a home here in Mankato, Minnesota and are seeking asylum in the United States.

The following Pastors represent five churches sponsoring this family: Pastor Trish Reedstrom ~ Messiah Lutheran; Melanie Wohlschlaeger ~ Christ the King Lutheran; Jay Dahlvang ~ Bethlehem Lutheran; John Odegard ~ Grace Lutheran; and Dave Reedstrom ~ Calvary Lutheran. In addition, Pastor Jacie Richmond, Associate Pastor, Bethlehem Lutheran, is the chairperson for the Welcome Team. Our congregations, located in Mankato, Minnesota, have made numerous contributions to this young family, including shelter, food, transportation, clothing, recreation, and shopping, to name a few.

Our congregations will continue collaborating their energy and resources to provide these supports for Ariac and Andrea and their two boys to a new home in the United States.

The family has adapted well since their arrival to Mankato's cold and windy winter season. Ariac and Andrea attend ESL classes, and the boys attend school. All four of them have met new friends and enjoying the friendship and relationships with their neighbors.

With God's love and support from our congregations, this family will mature and grow into a new way of life that wasn't possible when they lived in Nicaragua.

We sincerely hope and pray that Ariac, Andrea, Randy, and Kamil Cruz be granted asylum due to their life situation and their love for God.

#### THE CIRCLE

Reminds us, like a halo, that Christ's suffering on the cross was an act of devine intervention. The cruciform, a cross of equal arms, was first used by Christians in their early Church plans.
