Hymn of praise has ancient roots

PRAYER CORNER

In this Prayer Corner, we are examining various parts of the Lutheran liturgy and how we can incorporate them into our personal prayer life. This month we will focus on the "Gloria in Excelsis Deo," which is Latin for "Glory to God in the highest." In some traditions, this glorious hymn of praise is called the "Greater Doxology." Others refer to it as the "Angelic Hymn," because it echoes the words the angels sang to the shepherds when announcing Jesus' birth, as recorded in Luke 2:14 [NRSV]: "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" This Angelic Hymn was the first Christmas carol, and the inspiration for one of the carols we still sing, "Angels We Have Heard on High" [ELW 289], in which the phrase "Gloria in Excelsis Deo" is used as a refrain.

The Gloria has been a part of Christian liturgy since the 4th Century. It is one of the ancient hymns of the Church. It is included in our Evangelical Lutheran Worship as the "Hymn of Praise" [see, e.g., ELW pages 148-149], which goes like this:

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us, you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. When we sing this Hymn of Praise, or any song of praise, we glorify God and acknowledge that God alone is holy, magnificent, and worthy of our worship and praise. We "give God the glory" as every nation, tribe, language and people is exhorted to do in Revelation 14:7: "Fear God, and give him glory, for the hour of his judgment has come; and worship him who made heaven and the earth, and the sea and the springs of water."

This month, consider incorporating more "Glorias" into your personal prayer practice. Besides Luke 2:14, the Bible is full of references to the glory of God that you can use as prayers. Here are a few suggestions to get you started: 1 Chronicles 29:10-13, Psalm 72:18-19, Psalm 96:4-9, Luke 19:38, Romans 11:33-36, 1 Timothy 1:17, Jude 1:24-25 and Revelation 5:13. Praising God in this way not only honors God, but reminds us that God is sovereign, God is in control and God can be trusted.

Let them give glory to the Lord, and declare his praise in the coastlands. Isaiah 42:12
