As we move to a calendar year budget, we anticipate an increase of at least 3% (to keep pace with our ministries and expenses)

2) 3-Year Capital Campaign

- a. Priority One: Caring For Our Church Home (starting with the roof!)
- b. Priority Two: Enhancing Fellowship
- c. Priority Three: Eliminating our Mortgage

Why Do We Need a Capital Campaign Now?

Our building is the place we gather, and where we are Covered in God's Love. We are called to be good stewards and caretakers of our church home. Because of the immediate need for repair to protect the building from further water damage, this project is almost complete! The congregational council voted to move forward, with faith and confidence that we will provide the gifts necessary to pay for the project.

Our "Raise the Roof" Goal for Priority One is \$1.2M. This includes \$900,000 for the roof and \$300,000 for additional deferred maintenance and parking lot repairs.






PRAYER CORNER

Benediction=Blessing

As we near the end of the calendar year, we are also coming to the end of our study of the Lutheran liturgy. This month we will examine the Benediction or Blessing. The word “benediction” comes from the Latin “bene-dictio,” which means to speak well of, or to bless. The Benediction comes at the end of a worship service when the pastor speaks these words over the congregation:

The Lord bless you and keep you.
The Lord’s face shine upon you with grace and mercy.
The Lord look upon you with favor and give you peace.

[ELW pp. 114 and 136]. These beautiful words come from the book of Numbers, where the Lord instructed Moses to speak to his brother, Aaron, and to Aaron’s sons, who functioned as priests, and tell them to bless the Israelites with these specific words:

The Lord bless you and keep you;
The Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you;
The Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.

[Numbers 6:24-26 NRSVUE]. This blessing is known as the “Aaronic blessing.” The Lord further said to Moses, “So they (Aaron and his sons) shall put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them.” [Numbers 6:27].

As we know from our reading of the Old Testament, God did bless the Israelites with life, health, families, land, flocks, and God’s very presence.

The God of the Israelites has not changed. He is still the same God that we worship. As he said, “For I the Lord do not change.” [Malachi 3:6]. And just as God longed to bless his people of old, he longs to bless us, too. The words of the Benediction are not just empty words. They are a vivid reminder that we are blessed, that God is with us, that God smiles on us, and shows us grace and favor.



God bless you for your generosity and for supporting the students and our ministry at Crossroads. We look forward to seeing you again on Tuesday, November 11.


