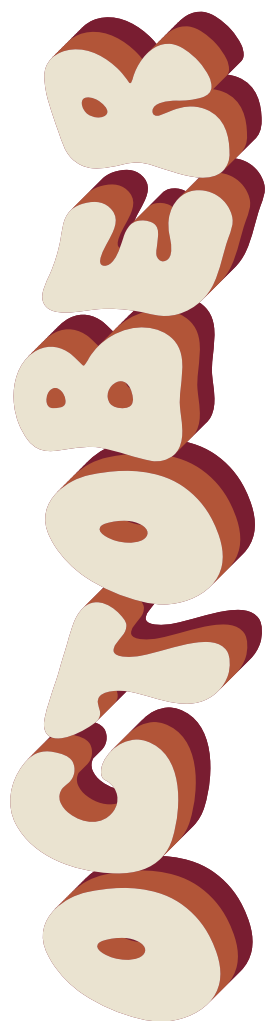

PRAYER CORNER

NUNC DIMITTIS :NOW LET YOUR SERVANT GO IN PEACE

In this Prayer Corner, we are examining various parts of the Lutheran liturgy and how we can incorporate them into our personal prayer practice. This month we focus on the “Nunc Dimittis,” from the Latin “Now you dismiss,” which is sung as part of the Communion service, immediately following the distribution of the bread and wine:

Now, Lord, you let your servant go in peace: your word has been fulfilled.

My own eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared in the sight of ev’ry people: a light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel.

Now, Lord, you let your servant go in peace.

[ELW pp. 113 and 135].

These words, which come from the book of Luke, were first sung by Simeon. [Luke 2:29-32]. Simeon was a righteous and devout man who had been promised by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Messiah. When Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem, to present him to the Lord, Simeon was there and recognized Jesus as the Savior, not only of Israel, but of all nations. Simeon took Jesus in his arms and praised God with the words of the Nunc Dimittis, which is why it is sometimes called “Simeon’s Song.”

This Luke passage shines a spotlight on Jesus as the fulfillment of God’s promise to

Simeon and to all people. Simeon knew the Old Testament prophecies regarding God’s plans for salvation and, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, identified Jesus as the one who would bring that salvation. Being in Jesus’ presence gave Simeon light, hope, and salvation, and allowed him to depart from this world in peace.

The same can be true for us. Although we cannot hold the infant Jesus in our arms, we experience his presence in Holy Communion, as we eat and drink his body and blood, given for the forgiveness of our sins. We can depart from the Communion table in peace, assured of our own salvation, even as we sing Simeon’s ancient song of faith.

Many people use the Nunc Dimittis in their personal prayer practice, finding consolation in its timeless message. It is a good reminder of the importance of recognizing God’s presence in everyday life, and of remembering and celebrating the times when we have sensed God’s presence. It is also a powerful declaration of faith in God’s ability to keep promises and deliver miracles. May you experience the deep peace that passes understanding as you pray Simeon’s Song.

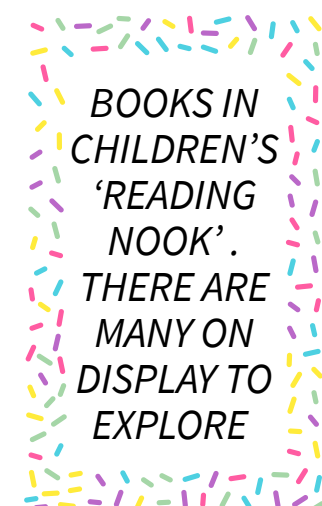
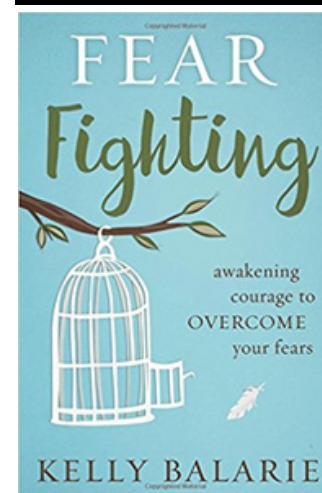
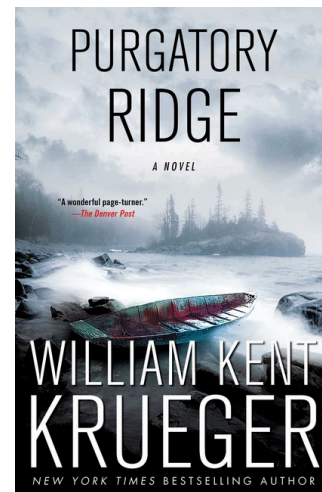

Please join us at Faith Continuum every Sunday in October to engage with offerings that will leave you with much to consider and be thankful for.

Presently scheduled for October 4 is meeting with our Congregational Council to hear their current priorities and activity.

On the 12th, Ceceli Bidelman of the YWCA Mankato will present on "Youth Mental Health First Aid Training". This is important training for parents, grandparents, teachers and community members.

Rev. Dr. Paul Meierding will present on October 19th and 26th. Pastor Paul earned a PhD in Biblical Studies at Luther Seminary and taught for two years in the Religion Department at Gustavus Adolphus College. You will not want to miss this riveting offering on: *The Miracles of Jesus* How are we to understand Jesus' miracles? In our nation's early history, many of our leaders were Deists, that is, they believed that God created the world, but that God rarely intervened in human affairs. In our present scientific age, we tend to discount stories of supernatural healing. We trust in doctors to heal through surgery and the prescription of medicine, and we're not confident that God acts supernaturally today. What happens to Christian faith, if miracles are rejected, especially when the miracle of Jesus' resurrection is rejected? Do we believe that God still acts powerfully? Do miracles occur today?
