1. Treasurer Report

• Waiting for the financials from Eide Bailly, no report at this time.

2. Pastor Salary & Housing Allowance & Other Compensation

- Pastor Melanie reached out to David K. to see how her compensation is split between her salary and housing allowance. No updates have been made since the original package agreement. Working with Eide Baily to get a more accurate picture of expenses; also looking to see if we can make changes for 2021 and 2022.
- ELCA recommends 30% for housing allowance
- Need to make a plan for an annual adjustment resolution for council approval on this issue.
- Another discussion between calendar year vs. CTK fiscal year; could compensation be considered on a calendar year basis? Or move our fiscal year to match the calendar year? This is indicated in the constitution.
- When should annual compensations be implemented for staff? What is the process Dana takes at Eide Bailly once the budget has passed?
- David K. and Pastor Melanie will work together to determine the ratio and will bring it back for approval

3. Cultivate Expenses

- Carbon Monoxide Monitors
 - David K. had a conversation with Candice: monitors are required for Cultivate but it was asked that CTK pay 50% of the cost; total cost is \$3349
 - Nancy P. moves to approval CTK to pay 50% of total cost from A+ Systems proposal of \$3349
 - David K. seconded

4. Roof Updates

Hearing Assist

Kathy Brozik provided a quick background on the Hearing Assistant technology and proposal for CTK. Also need to have further discussion on training for certain members, who become trainers for CTK members. Kathy proposes having a couple of trainers for CTK members; Dave suggested having at least one trainer from each service.

VSI quote includes:

- 1. Technology Equipment needed to upgrade the dual wifi/rf system
- 2. Four body packs for users without cell phones
- 3. Instruction-test-train

K. Brozik moved to approve the \$2,425 proposal to install Hearing Assistant technology in the CTK sanctuary from Terry Dahl with VSI

N. Patterson second

Discussion: Where will the money come from? Money will come from the Memorial Funds. Kathy will set up the training for certain members, ask for volunteers from each service, work with Word & Sacrament commission as well. Question for VSI: can the transmitter be moved for outdoor worship or will it only work in the sanctuary?

Vote: All approved

Projector Maintenance

New lamps are needed for the sanctuary projectors or we need to upgrade to new projectors. Cost for 2 projector bulbs is \$1384.80; they last about two years. Proposal from VSI for two new projectors: \$16,990. New projectors have a 7-10 year use and do not require bulbs (laser projectors). The projector model being proposed was discontinued in September 2020, which gives us the lower cost. Proposal does include one-year warranty; need to ask Terry if they will still provide tech support to the machines after that one year? Will the technology be outdated or just the machines? Council feels comfortable going through VSI, but would like to confirm with Terry.

G. Rudolf moved to approve the VSI proposal after confirming with Terry Dahl that this is still the system he recommends CTK should use.

K. Brozik seconded

Discussion: Where's the money coming from? This project would be funded by the memorial fund. Do the new projectors use lamps and how much do those cost? The new projectors use lasers and not lamps.

Vote: All approved

Via Email: September 1st, 2022

Pastor Melanie sent an updated proposal with different equipment models, but at the same price of \$16,990. Per the motion and vote above, this is approved.

Reproductive Justice Workshops at CTK

CTK received a building request from the Pastor at First Presbyterian and the ACLU to use CTK for some Reproductive Justice workshops, estimated 150 people; workshops in October. Pastor Melanie wants approval from the council since this can be considered a controversial topic. Quote from Pastor Melanie: "I believe the reproductive justice workshop aligns with our ELCA social statement that says abortions should remain safe, legal, accessible, and rare."

N. Patterson moved to allow the Reproductive Justice Workshops at CTK on Thursday, October 6, 5:30 - 9:30pm, sponsored by First Presbyterian and ACLU.

C. Sinning seconded

Discussion: Will there be a charge to hold the event at CTK; yes. Servant commission does meet on Thursdays, but have been meeting virtually. No other conflicts of events. Will the event be "one-sided"? Will the workshop be speakers, forums, open discussions? Pastor Melanie will email FPC to ask.

Council will wait to vote until we hear back from FPC with more details on the event. Will complete the vote via email.

Wish List for Memorials

Start thinking about a future wish list for memorial funds and how they should be used.

Computers/CTS

Will set up another meeting with the executive committee and CTS to ask a few questions regarding the cloud software update and the difference between purchasing and leasing computers. Table discussion until the next meeting.

Roof

We currently have three bids for work on the roof, however there are concerns about it being too late in the year to get it done before winter. All three bids are currently expired; will need to request for new bids. Schwickerts: \$108,983, includes 20 years warranty for materials

KRI: \$99,515, includes 15 year warranty for materials

Meisner: \$76,350, includes 2 year warranty for materials, also different materials

Carl will request if any of these companies will be able to get the work done yet this year and check on new bids. We have approximately \$50K left in RRR, but would need to find a way to raise the rest of the money. If we can't get this project done before winter, is there a temporary fix we can/should look into? G. Rudolf will work with Carl and help spearhead the project and send an email out to council with the update.

M. Spangrud moved to charge G. Rudolf to work with Carl and further investigate our three current bids and report back to the council as soon as possible.

- Word & Sacrament have been overseeing Worship Assistants; would like to continue to oversee
 ushers and the council and commissions would oversee/gather volunteers for communion for two
 months at a time, as it was in the past; youth would also help on Wednesday nights. Could this be
 a future task for Morgan? We serve communion every Saturday night, 1st, 3rd and sometimes 5th
 Sundays and Wednesdays; do not need to worry about communion for Saturday nights.

CTK Council Report By Pastor Melanie September 2022

1) Ukrainian Refugee Relief

CTK members have donated more than \$5,000 to Ukrainian Refugee resettlement efforts through Lutheran World Relief Ukraine Response.

Kathy Sallstrom, Kathy Hedman, and Cindy Kehoe are co-facilitating an effort to support a multigenerational family of 9 in Shakopee, MN. The opportunity to help this particular family arose after CTK hosted a informational meeting in July with Lynn Mullin, the volunteer coordinator, from LSS Immigration & Refugee Services in Minneapolis. Lynn followed up with people who attended the information session with the opportunity in Shakopee. While members of CTK would like to support a local asylee or refugee family the generosity that members of CTK want to extend to the family in Shakopee before us is astounding. Local ELCA pastors are meeting this Thursday to explore opportunities to support a family locally.

2) Crossroads Campus Ministry

Local ELCA pastors and church leaders plan to re-invigorate and renew the ELCA Campus Ministry at MNSU. We are planning toward an 8pm Sunday evening service led by area clergy and musicians beginning October 2nd. We currently have 16 students who have indicated interest in attending. I plan to lead on October 9th. Members of our congregation & community will be encouraged to attend.
