

## **STAR GROUPS**

### **SCRIPTURE**

Read the passage of Scripture. Write out or underline the verses or phrases that stood out to you from your reading.

### **TRUTH**

What is the principal or theme of the verses? Many times this might be a phrase or word that is repeated or it is a thought that stands out as you read it. Is the spirit highlighting a theme in the verses? What does it say about who God is?

### **APPLICATION**

How does this truth apply to my life and my circumstances? Is it calling me to action? If so describe.

### **RESPONSE**

Talk all right to God about what he is teaching you. This could involve confession, phrase, commitment, request, etc. This keeps your time in the Word a two way conversation. It is sometimes easy to stop at knowledge and not move into response.
