Dear Friends,

During this season of Advent – a time of watching and waiting - we prepare our hearts and look forward to celebrating the birth of the Christ Child. May we never lose sight that He is the reason we celebrate! As we reflect on this past year, and look with hope to the New Year, may we be reminded that we have a God who loves us unconditionally. He is a God who accepts us as we are, and carries us when the burdens are too much for us to handle.

For those who have lost a loved one, the holidays can be a very sad and painful time. I encourage you to seek out those who might be hurting at this time of year. Call and offer to spend time with them, listen to them, and invite them to come to church with you. Pray for them and ask God how he might use you to be a blessing in their life. Many times we fail to reach out because we're afraid of saying the wrong thing, so we avoid the person, or we avoid bringing up their grief. Most will tell you that it's better to risk saying the wrong thing, than nothing at all. Let people know you care and that you want to walk the journey with them. Sometimes the most meaningful thing you can do is to let that person know you remember the person they lost. Let people know you care – it's the best gift you can give.

As we celebrate this Christmas season, reach out to the people around you – your friends, coworkers, neighbors, and family members. Invite them to one of the Christmas services.

Maybe it's nothing more than a smile or word of encouragement. Be sensitive to those around you. As Jesus came to be the Light of the World, let His light shine through us. Let us be the hands and feet of Christ in our church, families, schools, workplaces and neighborhoods.

As we prepare to close one year and begin a new year, perhaps filled with doubt and uncertainty, the words of Psalm 46 come to mind: "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. ²Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; ³though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. ¹⁰Be still, and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations; I am exalted in the earth. ¹¹The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge."

The Psalmist reminds us that regardless of what happens, we are never outside of God's care. God works through us, leads us, guides us, but is always holding us. Through all the trials we may face, God is holding our hand. As we look to the New Year, we need to remember to put our hope in the one who will never let us down. Money, success, fame, and beauty all end. But "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Hebrews 13:8)

We have been given the powerful gift of prayer. Even when we don't have electricity, we are still connected to the greatest source of all power. Remember that God is the world's best wireless connection! We don't need electricity, Wi-Fi, or money to connect to God. He's there for us 24/7 and ready to listen. And he might be the only one wanting to listen when we can't sleep at night! We'll never get a busy signal or get put on hold. We have the opportunity to offer our prayers of intercession on behalf of those in need. It costs nothing except a willing heart to pray. Please continue to pray for EPLC – for the staff, leadership, members, and for all who call this their church home. May this continue to be a welcoming place of worship and may we continue to seek God's quidance and blessing.






Stuff a Holiday Stocking for The Night Ministry!
