Dear Friends, March is here and it's filled with so much. Please remember to turn your clocks ahead one hour on March 10th. It's better to turn your clocks ahead on March 9th just before going to sleep. This way, when you get up, you are at the correct time.

We are halfway through Lent. Lent is where we are to look into our hearts and see what gets in the way of our relationship with God. There are some things we can do to help with our relationship with God.

1 Prayer- This isn't big words or lengthy prayers. It's just about having a conversation. Talk to God as you would someone close to you.

2 Serving- When we serve and help someone, we take the focus off of ourselves. Jesus tells us that whatever we do to the least of these, we do to him. Helping someone in need is what we are called to do.

3 Read the bible- The bible not only tells us of how much God loves us, but also all that God has done for us. Join a bible study/small group. This is a great way to grow in your faith and community.

4 Worship- Come to worship regularly. It helps with understanding with what God is trying to tell us and you will feel a stronger connection to our community of faith. Worship has many facets to it. It's about thanking God for all we have been given. Experiencing singing songs of praise with other Christians is an amazing feeling; and receiving forgiveness through the Lord's Supper, that gives us new life.

5 Forgiveness- To forgive because we've been forgiven. Forgiveness lifts the pain of the hurt off of you and offers a new life. It truly has to be one of the most difficult of human acts, not only to give but also to receive. It is also one of the greatest gifts we can give or receive. Forgiveness says the past will not define us.

Holy Week and Easter are coming soon. It starts with Palm Sunday on March 24th with services at 9 am and 11:00 am. March 28th is Maundy Thursday with services at 12 pm and 7 pm. March 29th is Good Friday with services at 12 pm and 7 pm. Easter is March 31st with services at 6:30, 9, and 11:00.

There will be a special Easter service on Saturday, March 30th at 5 pm. Also, this service is for 1st responders, medical staff, and anyone who can't make Easter Sunday services because of work.

I love Easter, and some days make that happen, starting with Palm Sunday; with Jesus' triumphant ride into Jerusalem. The people are shouting for joy that Jesus is there.

Then we have Maundy Thursday where we receive the sacrament of Holy Communion, and then Good Friday is a time to reflect on Jesus' sacrifice on the cross for our sins. I want to invite you all to come in person and experience Holy Week in the fullest way.

Your worship experience will have a greater impact when you experience the passion and love that comes from Jesus in community.

Dear Friends,

On Ash Wednesday we began a pilgrimage, a journey in which each step we took matched one in a story. We began with ashes on our forehead, ashes that were made from the palm branches of Palm Sunday. As we continue on our Lenten journey, this month we walk with Jesus into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, the city where crowds welcomed him on the Sabbath by spreading palm branches under his feet, and where he was executed by the week's end.

And by the end of this month we'll gather for Holy Week, Good Friday, and the Easter celebration. For Christians, this is the highlight of the church year. Without the resurrection, it would just be another change of seasons. But as believers in Christ, we know that Jesus defeated death on that first Easter morning, and because he lives, we shall live also! This would be a great opportunity to invite friends, neighbors, or co-workers to come and hear this Good News!

The season of Lent gives us a chance to pause from our often hectic and over-scheduled days and reflect on how God is leading us and guiding our path. Remember that we have a God who loves us, forgives us, and accepts us – just as we are. There's nothing we can do to make God love us more, and there's nothing we can do to make God love us less. God loves us unconditionally and we are never outside of his care.

Lent is a journey towards the cross. And towards a tomb, and the mysterious, unending joy of those who found that tomb empty. This journey is a chance to rewrite our own stories, to take the chaotic and traumatic events of our lives and rewrite them into a new story, a new life. Only God in Christ cannot merely forgive sins, but make the sinner whole. Only he has the grace, which can change a sinner into a saint.

Easter is a living expression of the hope that God has brought into the world through the death and resurrection of Jesus. This hope of renewal and new life, both present and future is at the heart of the Good News. We are commissioned to share this hope with others. Who will <u>you</u> tell, and who will <u>you</u> invite, to come and hear the Good News that Christ is risen?

A much-loved tradition here at EPLC is the cross that is covered with Easter lilies on Easter morning. If you're new to our congregation, you might not know that it is the same cross that stood bare all during Lent inside the altar rail, and it was made from the last real Christmas tree that we had in the sanctuary. It holds a lot of history and tradition, and it's something that is very meaningful to many people. It's a labor of love to create the Easter cross and I'm thankful to the volunteers who have agreed to take on the project again this year. With so much change in our world, it's nice to still carry on a tradition that is so meaningful. After the Easter services, we put the cross outside for the community to see. If you'd like to donate toward the cost of this beautiful tradition, please just indicate "Easter Cross" on your envelope. You can also designate your donation as a memorial to honor a friend or loved one. Memorials are a great way to honor those dear to us, while at the same time providing a financial blessing for this ministry.

As we complete our Lenten journey and walk the path to Calvary, we remember that we have a Savior who loved us enough to die for us. And as we celebrate the Resurrection, we have the assurance that we will be united with him in a resurrection like his. Accept the grace and forgiveness that marks you as a redeemed child of God. Rejoice in that Good News!




