

Confession of Sin (unison)

Seeing how great and good God is, we are reminded that we have, more often than we wish, failed to live as God has designed. Gracious Lord, in the words of Zechariah, we recognize the depth of our sin and the wounds inflicted upon Your heart. We confess that we have failed to trust in Your provision, turning away from Your refuge and seeking safety in fleeting idols. We acknowledge the times we have been blind to Your grace, forgetting Your promise to cleanse us and draw us near.

Like those who mourn for the One they have pierced, we too grieve the ways we have rejected Your love, choosing pride and rebellion over humility and submission. Forgive us, we pray, for the times we have faltered in our faith, failing to honor You as our fountain of life and purity.

Cleanse us, Triune God, with the waters of Your mercy, and refine us as silver and gold in the fire of Your holiness. Teach us to embrace Your covenant of love, to walk in the strength of Your Spirit, and to proclaim Your salvation to the nations. May our lives reflect the cleansing You promise and the hope You restore through Your eternal care in Christ. Amen.

Silent Confession

Written words can never reflect exactly what is in each individual's heart, so this is a time for us to consider our own waywardness and speak it silently to God.

*Assurance of Pardon

When we confess our sins, seeking God's help to turn away from them, we are assured that He will extend grace, mercy and forgiveness. He is willing to do this because Jesus paid the penalty for our sins on the cross. Leader: Hear the promise of the Lord through the prophet Zechariah: Though the people mourn for the One they have pierced, the Lord opens a fountain to cleanse them from sin and impurity. He declares that He will refine His people as silver is refined and test them as gold is tested. They will call on His name, and He will answer them, saying, "They are My people," and they will respond, "The Lord is our God."

Beloved, rejoice in the assurance that through Christ, the fountain of life has been opened. Our sins are washed away, and the Lord calls us His own. Be glad, for the Good Shepherd restores us, refines us, and renews us as His people, united forever in His grace. Amen.

*Confession of Faith

Middle East Reformed Fellowship

(MERF is a family of churches throughout the Middle East; it began in Beirut, Lebanon in 1971)

Since the earliest years when disciples gathered, Christians have formulated statements to summarize what we believe. These creeds help remind us of the richness of our faith and can help answer the questions of those who may be wondering about Christianity. Leader: The Bible reveals the true and living God, Sovereign Creator and Ruler of the universe.

All: This one and only God is revealed as three distinct persons:

Leader: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, the same in substance, equal in power and glory, working all things after the counsel of His will.

All: Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who for us and for our salvation became fully man.

Leader: Being conceived by the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary, he was born of her without sin. He, by His perfect obedience and atoning death, provided full satisfaction to God for the sins of His elect people.

All: He was raised bodily from the dead and ascended to heaven where He sits at the right hand of God

Leader: From there, He reigns over His universal Church and Kingdom. At the last day, a day known only to the Father, He will return in glory to judge the living and the dead: the saved to enjoy His eternal glory and mercy, and the lost to suffer eternal conscious punishment.

All: The Holy Spirit is the one who inspired the prophets and apostles to write the Scriptures.

Leader: He authenticated their writings and ministry by means of supernatural gifts. He takes the things of Christ and sovereignly applies them to His people by calling, regenerating, sanctifying and glorifying them for Christ's eternal Kingdom.

All: The Church is the instrument ordained by God to bring the message of the Gospel to a lost and condemned human race and to carry out His purposes in the world.

Leader: The mission of the Church is, therefore, the preaching of the Gospel and the discipling of all nations, this mission being accompanied by "doing good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith."

All: AMEN!

Longing for the Lord in an Age of Discouragement and Disillusionment

Main Point: The Lord defends Jerusalem and works transformation.

Scripture

^{12:1} The oracle of the word of the Lord concerning Israel: Thus declares the LORD, who stretched out the heavens and founded the earth and formed the spirit of man within him: ² "Behold, I am about to make Jerusalem a cup of staggering to all the surrounding peoples. The siege of Jerusalem will also be against Judah. ³ On that day I will make Jerusalem a heavy stone for all the peoples. All who lift it will surely hurt themselves. And all the nations of the earth will gather against it. ⁴ On that day, declares the LORD, I will strike every horse with panic, and its rider with madness. But for the sake of the house of Judah I will keep my eyes open, when I strike every horse of the peoples with blindness. ⁵ Then the clans of Judah shall say to themselves, 'The inhabitants of Jerusalem have strength through the LORD of hosts, their God.'

⁶ "On that day I will make the clans of Judah like a blazing pot in the midst of wood, like a flaming torch among sheaves. And they shall devour to the right and to the left all the surrounding peoples, while Jerusalem shall again be inhabited in its place, in Jerusalem.

⁷ "And the LORD will give salvation to the tents of Judah first, that the glory of the house of David and the glory of the inhabitants of Jerusalem may not surpass that of Judah. ⁸ On that day the LORD will protect the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the feeblest among them on that day shall be like David, and the house of David shall be like God, like the angel of the LORD, going before them. ⁹ And on that day I will seek to destroy all the nations that come against Jerusalem.

¹⁰ "And I will pour out on the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem a spirit of grace and pleas for mercy, so that, when they look on me, on him whom they have pierced, they shall mourn for him, as one mourns for an only child, and weep bitterly over him, as one weeps over a firstborn. ¹¹ On that day the mourning in Jerusalem will be as great as the mourning for Hadad-rimmon in the plain of Megiddo. ¹² The land shall mourn, each family by itself: the family of the house of David by itself, and their wives by themselves; the family of the house of Nathan by itself, and their wives by themselves; the family of the house of Nathan by itself, and their wives by themselves; the family of the shimeites by itself, and their wives by themselves; ¹⁴ and all the families that are left, each by itself, and their wives by themselves.

^{13:1} "On that day there shall be a fountain opened for the house of David and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, to cleanse them from sin and uncleanness.

² "And on that day, declares the LORD of hosts, I will cut off the names of the idols from the land, so that they shall be remembered no more. And also I will remove from the land the prophets and the spirit of uncleanness. ³ And if anyone again prophesies, his father and mother who bore him will say to him, 'You shall not live, for you speak lies in the name of the LORD.' And his father and mother who bore him through when he prophesies.

⁴ "On that day every prophet will be ashamed of his vision when he prophesies. He will not put on a hairy cloak in order to deceive, ⁵ but he will say, 'I am no prophet, I am a worker of the soil, for a man sold me in my youth.' ⁶ And if one asks him, 'What are these wounds on your back?' he will say, 'The wounds I received in the house of my friends.' ⁷ "Awake, O sword, against my shepherd, against the man who stands next to me," declares the LORD of hosts. "Strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered; I will turn my hand against the little ones. ⁸ In the whole land, declares the LORD, two thirds shall be cut off and perish, and one third shall be left alive. ⁹ And I will put this third into the fire, and refine them as one refines silver, and test them as gold is tested. They will call upon my name, and I will answer them. I will say, 'They are my people'; and they will say, 'The LORD is my God.'"

Use these questions for your own personal reflection and study at home.

- 1. What is the connection between mourning for sin and cleansing from it?
- 2. What does heartfelt mourning look like in someone's life?
- 3. In your own life, how do you run away from God or try to remove him from your life?
- 4. How does the appropriation of Zechariah 12:1-13:9 by the Gospel writers show us both the depth of our sin and the greatness of God's saving grace?
- 5. How does God's grace lead us to a transformed life?
