*Confession of Faith

Augsburg Confession of Faith (1530)

Since the earliest years when disciples gathered, Christians have formulated statements to summarize what we believe. These creeds help remind us of the richness of our faith and can help answer the questions of those who may be wondering about Christianity.

Leader: How are we who are sinners, forgiven and declared righteous before God?

All: We cannot obtain forgiveness of sin and righteousness before God by our own merits, works, or satisfactions.

Leader: We receive forgiveness of sin and become righteous before God by grace for Christ's sake, through faith, when we believe that Christ suffered for us and that for his sake our sin is forgiven and righteousness and eternal life are given to us.

All: For God will regard and reckon this faith as righteousness.

Discipleship Explored: Following the One Who Loves Us

•	A Life in Christ Bears Fruit in Life and Death (vv. 19-26)
•	Final Remarks – Fellow Saint in Christ, Magnify Christ in your Life! (v. 26)

¹²I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel, ¹³ so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ. ¹⁴ And most of the brothers, having become confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, are much more bold to speak the word without fear.

¹⁵Some indeed preach Christ from envy and rivalry, but others from good will. ¹⁶The latter do it out of love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel. ¹⁷The former proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely but thinking to afflict me in my imprisonment. ¹⁸What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed, and in that I rejoice.

Yes, and I will rejoice, ¹⁹ for I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance, ²⁰ as it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death. ²¹ For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. ²² If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. ²³ I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better. ²⁴ But to remain in the flesh is more necessary on your account. ²⁵ Convinced of this, I know that I will remain and continue with you all, for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶ so that in me you may have ample cause to glory in Christ Jesus, because of my coming to you again.

Something to think about . . .

Use these questions for your own personal reflection and study at home.

- 1. What situation was Paul facing when he wrote Philippians 1:12-26? How did he interpret his imprisonment? How does Paul's perspective on adversity challenge or encourage you? In verses 12-14, what impact did Paul's chains have on others who were sharing the gospel? What adversity or challenge are you facing right now? How might God use it for good or for the advance of the gospel?
- 2. How does Paul respond to those who preach Christ out of envy or rivalry (verses 15-18)? What does this reveal about his priorities? Have you ever struggled with jealousy or comparison in ministry or faith? How can Paul's attitude help you respond?
- 3. Paul says, "to live is Christ, to die is gain" (verse 21). What does this phrase mean to you personally? How can this perspective change the way you view your life, work, and relationships? Why does Paul say that being with Christ after death is "far better," yet he still desires to stay and serve?
- 4. In verses 24-26, Paul expresses his desire to remain for the sake of others. Who in your life needs your encouragement, faith, or support? How does seeing your life in Christ as a platform for others' growth and joy in Christ change your approach to daily living?
