# **Confession of Sin**

Based on Romans 10:14-17

Seeing how great and good God is, we are reminded that we have, more often than we wish, failed to live as God has designed.

Leader: As we come to a time of corporate confession of sin, we remember the words from Romans: "How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in Him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? ... So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." Let us confess together:

All: Merciful God, we confess that though You invite us to Your table later this morning, we have often ignored Your call. Forgive us for our unbelief, for closing our hearts to Your word. We have been silent when we should have spoken, and inattentive when we should have listened. Wash us clean, and feed us with Your grace, that we may truly hear and truly believe.

#### **Silent Confession**

Written words can never reflect exactly what is in each individual's heart, so this is a time for us to consider our own waywardness and speak it silently to God.

#### \*Assurance of Pardon

Based on Romans 10:14-17

When we confess our sins, we are assured that He will extend grace, mercy and forgiveness because Jesus paid the penalty for our sins on the cross.

Leader: Hear the promise of the gospel: "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." Christ has spoken; His word brings life. As we trust in Him, our sins are pardoned and our souls made whole.

In Jesus Christ, you are forgiven. Come and rejoice, for the table is prepared and the Lord welcomes you home.

All: Thanks be to God!

## \*Confession of Faith (unison)

Apostle's Creed

Since the earliest years when disciples gathered, Christians have formulated statements to summarize what we believe. These creeds help remind us of the richness of our faith and can help answer the questions of those who may be wondering about Christianity.

I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; he descended into hell; the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there he shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy catholic\* church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

\*The term "catholic" means "universal," throughout all ages and generations.

## Celebration of the Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper was instituted by Jesus on the night before He was crucified. He blessed bread and wine to remind us of his sacrifice - the bread is the sign of his broken body and the juice we use is the sign of his shed blood.

Leader: Lift up your hearts!

**People:** We lift them up to the Lord.

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People:** It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Leader: Holy and merciful God, our Father, you have made us in your image and for yourself. You have made this good world for us to

tend and to enjoy. God our Father,

**People:** Hear the praise of grateful hearts.

Leader: You sought your ancient people when they strayed from you. You freed them from the oppressor and brought them home. God, our Father,

**People:** Hear the praise of grateful hearts.

Leader: You have sent your Son to bring us home to you.

Leader: By his Incarnation— **People:** You have found us.

Leader: By his Death— **People:** You have forgiven us.

Leader: By his Resurrection— **People:** You have freed us.

Leader: God, our Father, **People:** Hear the praise of

grateful hearts.

## **Prayer of Consecration**

God's promises are confirmed as we partake in faith — spiritual nourishment enabling our growth in grace, affirmation of our union with God, and gratitude for our fellowship with other believers.

The congregation will be invited by rows to receive bread and juice. When returning to your seat, please wait for us to take the elements together.

Leader: Holy and merciful God, our Father, send down your Holy Spirit on our bread and wine, that they may be for us the body and blood of Christ, and on your people, that we may be the body of Christ, reconciled to you and to each other by his blood. By your Holy Spirit make us—

**People:** One with Christ, one with each other, and one in mission to all the world,

Leader: Until Christ shall come in final victory and we feast together at his heavenly banquet. We cry,

People: Maranatha! Even so, come, Lord Jesus, come. Amen!

Facing a task unfinished that drives us to our knees, A need that, undiminished, rebukes our slothful ease. We who rejoice to know thee renew before thy throne The solemn pledge we owe thee to go and make thee known.

Chorus: We go to all the world, with kingdom hope unfurled; No other name has power to save, but Jesus Christ the Lord!

Where other lords beside thee hold their unhindered sway,
Where forces that defied thee defy thee still today,
With none to heed their crying for life, and love, and light,
Unnumbered souls are dying and pass into the night. (Chorus)

We bear the torch that, flaming, fell from the hands of those Who gave their lives, proclaiming that Jesus died and rose. Ours is the same commission, the same glad message ours; Fired by the same ambition, to thee we yield our pow'rs. (Chorus)

O Father who sustained them, O Spirit who inspired, Savior, whose love constrained them to toil with zeal untired, From cowardice defend us, from lethargy awake! Forth on thine errands send us to labor for thy sake. (Chorus 2x)

# Scripture

Matt. 28:18-20 – <sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

**Romans 10:14-17** – <sup>14</sup> How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? <sup>15</sup> And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" <sup>16</sup> But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" <sup>17</sup> So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

Use these questions for your own personal reflection and study at home.

- 1. In what ways is God calling you personally to participate in His mission—are you being prompted to go, send, or share the gospel in your current context?
- 2. Who in your life (your "one")—at work, school, or in your neighborhood—has yet to hear the message of Christ, and how can you intentionally build a relationship with them?
- 3. What obstacles or fears might be holding you back from sharing your faith, and how can you trust in Jesus' promise to be with you always as you step out in obedience?
- 4. How can you support the sending of others, such as missionaries, through prayer, giving, or encouragement?
- 5. Reflecting on Romans 10:14-17, how does understanding the necessity of hearing the word of Christ encourage you to take action in your community?
