#### Confession of Sin (unison)

Seeing how great and good God is, we are reminded that we have, more often than we wish, failed to live as God has designed.

Merciful God, You know us just as Jesus knew the woman at the well—our struggles, our stories, our thirsts. Yet, we confess that we have often sought satisfaction apart from You, turning to empty wells that cannot sustain us. Forgive us for withholding ourselves from You and from one another, for not sharing the gospel as tenderly as Paul shared his life with the Thessalonians. Cleanse us, and fill us with Your living water, that we may pour out Your love to others. In Christ we pray. Amen.

#### Silent Confession

Written words can never reflect exactly what is in each individual's heart, so this is a time for us to consider our own waywardness and speak it silently to God.

#### \*Assurance of Pardon

Based on 1 Thess. 2:8

When we confess our sins, we are assured that He will extend grace, mercy and forgiveness because Jesus paid the penalty for our sins on the cross.

Leader: Hear the good news! Jesus did not turn away from the woman at the well, but revealed Himself as the Messiah and brought salvation to her and her town. As Paul wrote, "We loved you so much that we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well."

In Christ, we are welcomed, restored, and sent to share His love. In Jesus Christ, you are forgiven. Drink deeply of His grace and rejoice!

All: Thanks be to God.

#### \*Confession of Faith

Heidelberg Catechism (Q/A 15-18)

Since the earliest years when disciples gathered, Christians have formulated statements to summarize what we believe. These creeds help remind us of the richness of our faith and can help answer the questions of those who may be wondering about Christianity.

Leader: What kind of mediator and deliverer should we look for then?

**All:** One who is a true and righteous human, yet more powerful than all creatures, that is, one who is also true God.

Leader: Why must the mediator be a true and righteous human?

**All:** God's justice demands that human nature, which has sinned, must pay for sin; but a sinful human could never pay for others.

Leader: Why must the mediator also be true God?

**All:** So that the mediator, by the power of his divinity, might bear the weight of God's wrath in his humanity and earn for us and restore to us righteousness and life.

Leader: Then who is this mediator—true God and at the same time a true and righteous human?

**All:** Our Lord Jesus Christ, who was given to us to completely deliver us and make us right with God.

# Scripture

John 4:1-30; 39-43 – <sup>1</sup> Now when Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard that Jesus was making and baptizing more disciples than John <sup>2</sup> (although Jesus himself did not baptize, but only his disciples), <sup>3</sup> he left Judea and departed again for Galilee. <sup>4</sup> And he had to pass through Samaria. <sup>5</sup> So he came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the field that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. <sup>6</sup> Jacob's well was there; so Jesus, wearied as he was from his journey, was sitting beside the well. It was about the sixth hour.

<sup>7</sup> A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." <sup>8</sup> (For his disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.) <sup>9</sup> The Samaritan woman said to him, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask for a drink from me, a woman of Samaria?" (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.) <sup>10</sup> Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." <sup>11</sup> The woman said to him, "Sir, you have nothing to draw water with, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? <sup>12</sup> Are you greater than our father Jacob? He gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did his sons and his livestock." <sup>13</sup> Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, <sup>14</sup> but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." <sup>15</sup> The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I will not be thirsty or have to come here to draw water."

16Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here." <sup>17</sup> The woman answered him, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You are right in saying, 'I have no husband'; <sup>18</sup> for you have had five husbands, and the one you now have is not your husband. What you have said is true." <sup>19</sup> The woman said to him, "Sir, I perceive that you are a prophet. <sup>20</sup> Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you say that in Jerusalem is the place where people ought to worship." <sup>21</sup> Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. <sup>22</sup> You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. <sup>23</sup> But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. <sup>24</sup> God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." <sup>25</sup> The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things." <sup>26</sup> Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am he."

- <sup>27</sup> Just then his disciples came back. They marveled that he was talking with a woman, but no one said, "What do you seek?" or, "Why are you talking with her?" <sup>28</sup> So the woman left her water jar and went away into town and said to the people, <sup>29</sup> "Come, see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?" <sup>30</sup> They went out of the town and were coming to him.
- <sup>39</sup> Many Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me all that I ever did." <sup>40</sup> So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with them, and he stayed there two days. <sup>41</sup> And many more believed because of his word. <sup>42</sup> They said to the woman, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is indeed the Savior of the world." <sup>43</sup> After the two days he departed for Galilee.
- **1 Thesselonians 2:8** <sup>8</sup> So, being affectionately desirous of you, we were ready to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you had become very dear to us.

# Something to think about ...

Use these questions for your own personal reflection and study at home.

- 1. Read reflectively John 4 and 1 Thessalonians 2:8.
- 2. What are some ways that you can build authentic relationships with others in your daily life to share the gospel?
- 3. How does the example of Jesus and the Samaritan woman illustrate the importance of relational evangelism?
- 4. Why do you think personal testimony is such a powerful tool in sharing your faith?
- 5. According to 1 Thessalonians 2:8, what does it mean to share not only the gospel, but also your life with others?
- 6. If you feel hesitant or unsure about sharing your faith, what encouragement can you draw from the idea that God uses ordinary people for extraordinary purposes?
- 7. What practical steps can you take this week to pray for courage and seek opportunities to share your "God story" with someone? Who is a Christian friend that you can ask to help each other to share your faith?
- 8. In what ways can you demonstrate compassion and love to those around you, reflecting the heart of Jesus in your relationships?
