Confession of Sin (unison)

Based on Matt 5:13-16; Colossians 4:2-6

Seeing how great and good God is, we are reminded that we have, more often than we wish, failed to live as God has designed.

Gracious God, we confess that we have not always shined with the light of Christ or seasoned our words with grace. Too often, we have hidden our light, failed to pray as we ought, and spoken carelessly, forgetting the impact of our witness. Forgive us for neglecting opportunities to glorify You and bless others. Renew us by Your Spirit, that our lives and speech may reflect the love and wisdom of Jesus. In His name we pray. Amen.

Silent Confession

Written words can never reflect exactly what is in each individual's heart, so this is a time for us to consider our own waywardness and speak it silently to God.

When we confess our sins, we are assured that He will extend grace, mercy and forgiveness because Jesus paid the penalty for our sins on the cross.

Leader: Hear the assurance of God's grace: In Christ, you are forgiven and empowered to be salt and light in the world. God's Spirit equips you to pray faithfully, speak graciously, and live wisely among all people.

All: Thanks be to God! We receive Your forgiveness and strength to shine for Christ wherever we go.

*Confession of Faith

Heidelberg Catechism (Q/A 15-18)

Since the earliest years when disciples gathered, Christians have formulated statements to summarize what we believe. These creeds help remind us of the richness of our faith and can help answer the questions of those who may be wondering about Christianity.

Leader: What kind of mediator and deliverer should we look for then?

All: One who is a true and righteous human, yet more powerful than all creatures, that is, one who is also true God.

Leader: Why must the mediator be a true and righteous human?

All: God's justice demands that human nature, which has sinned, must pay for sin; but a sinful human could never pay for others.

Leader: Why must the mediator also be true God?

All: So that the mediator, by the power of his divinity, might bear the weight of God's wrath in his humanity and earn for us and restore to us righteousness and life.

Leader: Then who is this mediator—true God and at the same time a true and righteous human?

All: Our Lord Jesus Christ, who was given to us to completely deliver us and make us right with God.

Next Week: Advent Series – Jesus, The Unexpected King King Jesus Brings Saving Hope in the Midst of Our Brokenness (Mark 13: 24-37)

Scripture

Matthew 5:13-16 – ¹³ "You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet. ¹⁴ "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.

Colossians 4:2-6 – ² Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving. ³ At the same time, pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ, on account of which I am in prison— ⁴ that I may make it clear, which is how I ought to speak. ⁵ Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time. ⁶ Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person.

Something to think about . . .

Use these questions for your own personal reflection and study at home.

- 1. What does it mean to be "salt and light" in your everyday life? How can you apply this concept in your current relationships?
- 2. In what ways do you find it challenging to live faithfully among non-believers? How might Christ empower you in those moments?
- 3. Think about someone you know who doesn't have a relationship with Jesus. How can prayer for them change your perspective or actions?
- 4. Describe a time when you invited your Christian friends to join a time with your non-Christian friends. What did you learn from the experience?
- 5. How do you balance maintaining your Christian witness while being present and engaged with people who don't share your faith?
- 6. What steps can you take this week to ensure your life points others to Christ?
- 7. What specific wisdom, courage, or grace do you need to live evangelistically every day?
