

*Confession of Faith

Since the earliest years when disciples gathered, Christians have formulated statements to summarize what we believe. These creeds help remind us of the richness of our faith.

Leader: What is the visible Church?

All: The visible Church is a society made up of all such as in all ages and places of the world do profess the true religion, and of their children.

Leader: What are the special privileges of the visible Church?

All: The visible Church hath the privilege of being under God's special care and government; of being protected and preserved in all ages, notwithstanding the opposition of all enemies; and of enjoying the communion of saints, the ordinary means of salvation, and offers of grace by Christ to all the members of it in the ministry of the gospel, testifying, that whosoever believes in him shall be saved, and excluding none that will come unto him.

Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen.”
