

## Confession of Sin

Based on Genesis 17

*Seeing how great and good God is, we are reminded that we have, more often than we wish, failed to live as God has designed.*

**Leader:** Holy and gracious God, You are El Shaddai—the God who is enough, the God who keeps covenant from generation to generation. Yet like Abraham, we often struggle to trust Your promises.

**All:** Lord, have mercy on us.

**Leader:** You call us to walk before You and be blameless, but we confess that we often walk in our own strength. We grow impatient in waiting, we take matters into our own hands, and we try to set the terms of our relationship with You.

**All:** Forgive us, Lord.

Leader: You mark Your people as belonging to You, yet we live as though we belong to ourselves. You promise, “I will be your God,” but we chase after lesser gods—comfort, control, approval, and self-reliance.

**All:** Cleanse us, O God.

Leader: Have mercy on us for our unbelief, our forgetfulness, and our half-hearted obedience. Renew in us the joy of belonging to You, and teach us to rest in Your covenant love.

**All:** Amen.

## Silent Confession

*Written words can never reflect exactly what is in each individual’s heart, so this is a time for us to consider our own waywardness and speak it silently to God.*

## \*Assurance of Pardon

Rooted in God’s Covenant Promises

*When we confess our sins, seeking God’s help to turn away from them, we are assured that He will extend grace, mercy and forgiveness. He is willing to do this because Jesus paid the penalty for our sins on the cross.*

Leader: Hear the good news of the gospel. The God who said to Abraham, “I will establish my covenant... to be God to you and to your offspring after you” is the same God who has kept His promise in Jesus Christ.

In Christ, the true Seed of Abraham, God has bound Himself to us forever.

In Christ, every covenant promise finds its “Yes and Amen.”

In Christ, our sins are forgiven—not because we are faithful, but because He is.

To all who turn to God in repentance and trust in Jesus Christ, hear His covenant promise:

“I will be your God.”

“I will never leave you nor forsake you.”

“I will remember your sins no more.”

## \*Confession of Faith

From the Batak Protestant Church  
in Sumatra, Indonesia

*Since the earliest years when disciples gathered, Christians have formulated statements to summarize what we believe. These creeds help remind us of the richness of our faith and can help answer the questions of those who may be wondering about Christianity.*

**Leader:** We believe and confess:

**All:** God is one, without beginning and end, almighty, unchangeable, faithful, omniscient, inscrutable, a righteous judge, of great mercy, gracious.

**Leader:** Our God is one, and also triune, namely: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

**All:** God the Father creates, preserves, and rules all things visible and invisible.

**Leader:** He fills heaven and earth and is true, holy, and loving.

**All:** God the Son, who became man, was born of the Virgin Mary, conceived by the Holy Spirit, and is called Lord Jesus.

**Leader:** Two natures are found in him, namely the divine and human, inseparable in one person. Jesus Christ is true God but also true man.

**All:** He suffered in agony at the time of the rule of Pilate, was crucified and died in order to deliver us from sin, from death and from the power of the devil.

**Leader:** He became the perfect sacrifice to make reconciliation with God because of all the sins of mankind. He was buried, rose again on the third day, ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of God Jehovah, his Father who has glory forever.

**All:** He is in heaven interceding for us, ruling everything, until he will come again to the earth to judge the quick and the dead.

**Leader:** God the Holy Spirit calls and teaches the Church and preserves it in faith and holiness in the gospel for the Glory of God.

**All:** This we believe and confess. Amen

<sup>1</sup> When Abram was ninety-nine years old the Lord appeared to Abram and said to him, “I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless, <sup>2</sup> that I may make my covenant between me and you, and may multiply you greatly.” <sup>3</sup> Then Abram fell on his face. And God said to him, <sup>4</sup> “Behold, my covenant is with you, and you shall be the father of a multitude of nations. <sup>5</sup> No longer shall your name be called Abram, but your name shall be Abraham, for I have made you the father of a multitude of nations. <sup>6</sup> I will make you exceedingly fruitful, and I will make you into nations, and kings shall come from you. <sup>7</sup> And I will establish my covenant between me and you and your offspring after you throughout their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you. <sup>8</sup> And I will give to you and to your offspring after you the land of your sojournings, all the land of Canaan, for an everlasting possession, and I will be their God.”

<sup>9</sup> And God said to Abraham, “As for you, you shall keep my covenant, you and your offspring after you throughout their generations. <sup>10</sup> This is my covenant, which you shall keep, between me and you and your offspring after you: Every male among you shall be circumcised. <sup>11</sup> You shall be circumcised in the flesh of your foreskins, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and you. <sup>12</sup> He who is eight days old among you shall be circumcised. Every male throughout your generations, whether born in your house or bought with your money from any foreigner who is not of your offspring, <sup>13</sup> both he who is born in your house and he who is bought with your money, shall surely be circumcised. So shall my covenant be in your flesh an everlasting covenant. <sup>14</sup> Any uncircumcised male who is not circumcised in the flesh of his foreskin shall be cut off from his people; he has broken my covenant.”

<sup>15</sup> And God said to Abraham, “As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her name Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. <sup>16</sup> I will bless her, and moreover, I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall become nations; kings of peoples shall come from her.” <sup>17</sup> Then Abraham fell on his face and laughed and said to himself, “Shall a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Shall Sarah, who is ninety years old, bear a child?” <sup>18</sup> And Abraham said to God, “Oh that Ishmael might live before you!” <sup>19</sup> God said, “No, but Sarah your wife shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac. I will establish my covenant with him as an everlasting covenant for his offspring after him. <sup>20</sup> As for Ishmael, I have heard you; behold, I have blessed him and will make him fruitful and multiply him greatly. He shall father twelve princes, and I will make him into a great nation. <sup>21</sup> But I will establish my covenant with Isaac, whom Sarah shall bear to you at this time next year.”

<sup>22</sup> When he had finished talking with him, God went up from Abraham. <sup>23</sup> Then Abraham took Ishmael his son and all those born in his house or bought with his money, every male among the men of Abraham’s house, and he circumcised the flesh of their foreskins that very day, as God had said to him. <sup>24</sup> Abraham was ninety-nine years old when he was circumcised in the flesh of his foreskin. <sup>25</sup> And Ishmael his son was thirteen years old when he was circumcised in the flesh of his foreskin. <sup>26</sup> That very day Abraham and his son Ishmael were circumcised. <sup>27</sup> And all the men of his house, those born in the house and those bought with money from a foreigner, were circumcised with him.

## Something to think about . . .

---

Use these questions for your own personal reflection and study at home.

1. How did God introduce himself when he appeared to Abram? What does this say about God and his character? What did he ask Abram to do?
2. Why did God give Abram a new name? What does Abraham mean? What is the significance of Sarai's new name?
3. Did the covenant blessings affect only Abraham? Why is it significant that God promised to be Abraham's God and the God of his descendants?
4. What does circumcision denote for Abraham and his descendants? What is the connection between circumcision and baptism? What do they both signify?
5. God displayed ownership of Abraham's life by changing his name and requiring circumcision. How does the God Almighty display ownership of your life?
