Trials and Verdicts

There are a total of six trials Jesus faces between Gethsemane and the cross

- Three held by the Jewish religious leaders and three held by Rome
- The Jewish trials were held by Annas, Caiaphas, and the Sanhedrin
- All the trials held by the Jews were in violation of the Old Testament Law
- All the trials held by the Jews produced a pre-meditated verdict of guilty
- The Roman trials were all conducted properly within the Roman system
- These trials went from Pilate, to Herod, to Pilate
- Formal charge asked for, investigation sought, post-trial verdict delivered
- All the trials held by the Romans produced a not guilty verdict

Three Contrasts in Trial

Contrast 1: The hypocrisy of worldly religion

- Worldly religion chooses <u>ritual</u> over <u>righteousness</u>
- Worldly religion <u>deflects</u> and <u>defers</u> responsibility

Application: Be wary of prioritizing religious ritual over <u>heart transformation</u>

Contrast 2: A king from an other-worldly kingdom

• Jesus' kingdom relies on truth not force

Application: Jesus' followers <u>listen to</u> and <u>represent in the world</u> His truthful voice

Contrast 3: The <u>tragic rejection</u> of absolute truth

• Pilate's fear and cynicism blinds him to the truth before him

Application: we need to reject turning our backs on truth for the sake of <u>convenience</u>, <u>cynicism</u>, <u>or worldly priorities</u>
