Prayer of Illumination Bible Reading – Exodus 15:1-21 Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the LORD: "I will sing to the LORD, for he is highly exalted. Both horse and driver he has hurled into the sea. ² "The LORD is my strength and my defense^[a]; he has become my salvation. He is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him. ³The Lord is a warrior; the LORD is his name. ⁴ Pharaoh's chariots and his army he has hurled into the sea. The best of Pharaoh's officers are drowned in the Red Sea.^[b] ⁵ The deep waters have covered them; they sank to the depths like a stone. ⁶ Your right hand, LORD, was majestic in power. Your right hand, LORD, shattered the enemy. ⁷ "In the greatness of your majesty you threw down those who opposed you. You unleashed your burning anger; it consumed them like stubble. ⁸ By the blast of your nostrils the waters piled up.
