Message: Pastor Chris P

+Inadequacy and unworthiness—we encounter this (Peter's) fear in the face of the power and abundance of God made manifest in Jesus.

+Peter's words and the overall pattern of calling echo Isaiah's call (see Isaiah 6).

Place Matters (No Insignificant Place)

+Luke's narrative moves from baptism and wilderness to Jesus doing his ministry in two small and seemingly insignificant towns in the Roman world.

+There is no insignificant place in God's Kingdom—Jesus isn't wasting his breath and energy in preaching and being present in these kinds of places.

*What are some of the assumptions of the places you inhabit? Do you see any kingdom significance?

People Matter (Jesus Loves the “Wrong” Kind of People)

+We are reminded here of the commonness of the disciples. Small-town fisherman joining the mission of God.

+“Jesus friend of sinners” is a theme of Luke demonstrated to Peter. Jesus doesn't deny his claim. However it doesn't seem to define Peter either. What can this pattern teach us about ourselves and others?

“Go Deep”

+The Disciples are here called to a full-scale abandonment of their job/career...“*They left everything and followed him.*”

+Jesus is not likely issuing this particular call to us, but the invitation to go to back again into the “deep water”. Places of risk, outside of routine, places/people maybe we have written off.

+Ultimately overcoming this fear isn't about trying harder or following better but it's about the power of God's call in our inadequate lives.
