MUSINGS:

The turkey has been rendered down to its most basic form: a sandwich. Other leftovers have likewise been disposed of in any number of different ways. And now, looms the specter of Christmas and all of the paraphernalia that goes with it.

We have to buy the tree, or at least resurrect the artificial one we have tucked somewhere in the basement. And of course, there are the outside decorations. And who can forget the shopping to find the perfect gift? Periodically, there are parties to celebrate the season. Every year, it seems to become a bigger deal to the point where we sigh a sigh of relief when all the festivities are all over, and we can return to normal.

Madison Avenue, Daddy Warbucks, and Saturnalia have largely redefined what this time of the year is all about. We forget. What started as the celebration of the coming of the Messiah, to remake the world in the image of God, has slowly been transformed into a birthday party whose meaning can get lost in the frenzy of the season. We console ourselves by saying, "It's about the giving."

On one hand, of course, it is. We celebrate God's giving us a visible reminder of his presence with us. And so, Christmas becomes another Thanksgiving. On the other hand, it is about receiving that which we could not manufacture for ourselves.

Jesus came to show us what the love of God is like. The fact that he came as an infant and not as a conqueror should speak volumes. Of course, we can further our misunderstanding by saying that he came as a meek and mild the first time, but will come again as the divine militaris. That means we just put off the inevitable judgment of our enemies until later.

Jesus, as a child, was God's way of demonstrating patience with a species that is impatient and irritable at best, even as we display great acts of courage and compassion. God gave Jesus time to grow and thrive among us so that at some point he could still say, "There is another way." And then, he lived that other way in the face of relentless pressure. Take care of himself first, do fancy tricks to win people over, and finally, to make a deal with the apparent ruler of the earth. In other words, play by everyone else's rules. He died, not for our sins but because of our sins. He died to show just how far God would go to convince us of his love for us and for all people. And God raised him to show us that nothing we could do would thwart his will for creation.

And so, the message of Christmas is multileveled. It is a message of patience. It is one of love and understanding. It is one of not going along with the crowd but rather living our lives caring for others and doing what is right, even when it is difficult. In the process, we find it to be a message of healing, of hope, and life as we only wished it could be.

From me and my house, we wish you a Merry Christmas.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE LFPC SESSION MEETING 11/10/2025

- We have received \$182,973 towards our &202,400 for 2025 thus far
- During Advent, Life of the Congregation will be before the prelude and a time for meditation during the prelude will be observed
- A jazz band that Sam Anderson is part of will be hosting a jazz band concert on Friday, December 19 that is open to the community and is free of charge
- It was agreed that we would work towards increasing our budget for mission each year with the ultimate goal of 10% of the total budget. This may take a few years, Currently, we are at 4%.
- The Deacons will be offering a parking lot ministry to help escort congregants when the parking lot is icy.




