FROM THE PASTOR

Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked, 'what do you want?' They replied "Teacher, where do you abide?" John 1:38.

In these days of chaos, the clash of kingdoms, and the challenge of how to follow Jesus in the world, where we abide is of great importance. The disciples may have been asking literally where Jesus was living since he was new to the area. But the word abiding is used over and over again in John's gospel to talk about deeper spiritual matters of what grounds us to reality, God's grace, and ourselves as the habitation of the Christ Jesus on earth.

When we are grounded in Christ who is abides in the Father then our anger, concern, longing, and fear have their own rightful place and purpose. When we allow these states to be the ground where we live then we are truly on shaky ground and shifting sand. Anger becomes outrage, concern becomes anxiety, longing become untethered from what is before our eyes, and we don't have fear we become our fear.

Abiding in Christ and his words abiding in us helps us to know the next right step to take. When we are abiding in Christ through prayer and contemplation, spiritual practices, and trust then we will be at home.


