

FROM THE PASTOR

MUSINGS:

The Crowning Day of November is Thanksgiving. Its origins are in Plymouth Colony in 1621, when surviving colonists gathered together to give thanks for having survived an unusually harsh winter and the rigors of a strange new world. Their survival had been aided by a local tribe of Wampanoag people, who taught them basic survival skills that ultimately made the difference between life and death. On the day of their gathering, the people of Plymouth were joined by those same people, and the party is reported to have lasted for three days. The aftermath was peace that lasted for fifty years.

There are claims that Plymouth was not the first such celebration. The Virginia colony also claims to be the first, two years earlier. And the Spanish, in Florida, also celebrated their survival in 1565. The common thread is that the indigenous people of the area were instrumental in their survival AND the resulting celebration!

Years later, George Washington proclaimed a national day of thanksgiving, the first Thanksgiving proclamation of the US Government, in which he called for a day of gratitude marking the end of the war and the ratification of the Constitution. In 1863, President Abraham Lincoln declared a National Thanksgiving Day in the United States, to be held on the last Thursday of each November. And the celebration has continued since then. The day has changed, back and forth, over the years, until it was set as the 4th Thursday in November by an act of Congress at the direction of President Roosevelt.

During that time, the celebration has spread around the world to various countries, some at the instigation of people of the United States who have come, stayed, and left their mark. Canada, for example, recently celebrated their Thanksgiving in October. In addition, Australia, Brazil, Germany, Liberia, the Netherlands, the Philippines, and St. Lucia all celebrate their own version of Thanksgiving.

As I write this, several thoughts have come to mind. Our ancestors did not discover this land; they colonized a land that was occupied by people who had been here for thousands of years and established a thriving culture. Those people welcomed newcomers, showed them how to survive, and attempted to live peacefully side-by-side. What a profound example for us today as we face newcomers.

Thanksgiving is a natural response, shared by people everywhere, in gratitude for surviving events of all sorts, or simply for having survived and thrived. As it is, we teach our children to say "thank you" whenever they receive a gift of any sort. And so, our Thanksgiving celebrations are both well taken and considerably more than mounds of food and football.

And finally, though certainly not exhaustively, it seems to me that for thanksgiving to be real, it must be more than simply words. What does our gratitude cause us to do? If our thanksgiving is to be real, it must be more than words. And it needs to be more than a one-and-done. It needs to become a way of life.

As we gather 'round our tables this year, perhaps we can not only give thanks but give thought to the many ways we have been blessed and how we can become a blessing to our world, so torn by strife and uncertainty.

Happy Thanksgiving – from our house to yours.




