

# FROM THE PASTOR

#### **MUSINGS:**

The first Sunday in October is known as World Communion Sunday. First celebrated in 1933 at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, it gradually was accepted by many churches and denominations around the world. In 1936, the Presbyterian Church, USA, adopted the celebration, as did the Federal Council of Churches in 1940.

World Communion serves to symbolically demonstrate Christian unity worldwide and to remind us that we are all one in Christ. During the Second World War, it was increasingly celebrated by churches around the world, even amidst the carnage.

When we gather at the Table on any communion Sunday, we proclaim that it is the joyful feast of the people of God. Of course, it is a stretch to call it a "feast" until we remember, like so much else we do, it is wrapped in symbolism, of realities we can only begin to imagine. We are there on invitation by the one who has called each of us by name. And that invitation is not based on anything we have done, but on God's unimaginable grace.

Years ago, at a gathering of the Presbytery of Philadelphia, where I was co-celebrant, I delineated who was welcome at the table. Ordinarily, celebrants say: "People will come from east and west, from north and south, to sit at the table of the Lord." However, on this particular morning, I ventured to clarify what that meant. "... male and female, young and old, red, yellow, black, and white and brown, tall and short, fat and skinny, educated and simple, republican, democrat, socialist, communist, and non-committed, gay and straight ... ALL these and more will sit together at the table of the Lord.

The emphasis of the sacrament, on this day, is our unity, and in these days of escalating turmoil, it is imperative that we affirm those things we have in common and celebrate our differences. This is so because our differences give us strength and perspective that is lacking in just one perspective or approach.

We ARE the Body of Christ. Just as every body is made up of many parts, and those parts, though different, work together for the benefit of the whole, so that together the body is whole and strong. It is in this spirit that we gather on World Communion Sunday.

I hope to see YOU at worship.



#### Isaiah's Table

Isaiah's Table is an elder-led faith community that is a member of the Cayuga Syracuse Presbytery. It was formed in 2012 by a group of ruling elders who felt called to serve the underserved in Syracuse's near west side. Isaiah's Table holds a worship service every Saturday at 10 am after providing breakfast at 9:30 for members of the community, who are invited to stay for worship. Breakfast includes a biscuit or wrap, fruit, a muffin, and juice or milk. Coffee and tea are also available. Approximately 40-50 people are served breakfast

each Saturday. Isaiah's Table also provides Wednesday evening "Spiritual Nurture" gatherings via Zoom.

Isaiah's Table has a Little Free Pantry outside its building at the corner of Niagara and Marcellus Streets. It provides much needed grocery items and is frequented by neighbors and unhoused community members. To support this ministry, you can bring non-perishable food items and leave them in the "Isaiah's Table Food Pantry" basket located just inside the door on the parking lot side of Liverpool 1st Presbyterian Church. Donations will be delivered to Isaiah's Table once a month. If you'd rather, feel free to stop by the pantry, which is located at 223 Marcellus Street, to drop off your items.

In addition to the above, Isaiah's Table partners with PEACE, Inc. Westside Family Resource Center on the 3rd Thursday of each month by holding a Basic Needs Pantry which provides free personal care items, household paper products, and cleaning and laundry supplies for their clients.

Isaiah's Table is in need of financial support to help defray the cost of items for the Basic Needs Pantry and the Little Free Pantry.
