That's what Meghan's boss said as we were sitting at the Igloo in Silver Lake. We met there one Saturday because of a birthday party. Those words have been rattling around my brain ever since.

To best illustrate what he was talking about, I need you to think back to the days of Amplitude Modulated or AM radio. Yes, I know what AM radio is (I hear you making comments about my age □).

On an AM signal there is often a little bit of static in the background, while in the foreground you are hearing what you want to hear. Whether it be a race, ball game, or some oldies music. The background would be the "noise." The ball game or oldies music would be the "signal" or the thing you really wanted to hear.

I got to thinking about how that applies to general things in life, like my to-do list.

I have also been thinking about how that works in the spiritual aspects of life. See in John 10 Jesus says this:

"16 I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. **They too will listen to my voice**, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd." (John 10:16, NIV, emphasis added)

So if we are Christians, we will listen to his voice. Jesus also says in Revelation 3:

"20 Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me." (Revelation 3:20, NIV)

So Jesus is going to be calling for us and if we are His, we need to be ready to hear it.

With all the distractions of life (noise), with all of the bad things on the news (noise), with all of our discomforts (noise), with all the wars or rumors of wars (noise), with all of our worries (noise), with the deceitfulness of wealth (noise), with the pursuit of pleasure (noise), are we able to hear the voice of Jesus (signal)?

This is something that I keep thinking about. I keep asking myself, "what do I need to do to turn the knob on the radio of my life to get a clearer signal and less noise?"

So I want to take a moment and ask you the same, what do you need to do in your life, so you hear less noise of the world, and more of the signal of Jesus Christ?



Urbana Yoke Parish Board Minutes August 2025

The Urbana Yoke Parish Board met for their monthly meeting on Wednesday, August 13, 2025. Claud Newcomb opened the meeting in prayer and Aaron Mattern called the meeting to order.

The Secretary's Report (minutes by Dawn Mattern in July) was presented and approved with a motion by Tami Overman and a second by Richard Monce.

The Treasurer's Report was presented and approved with a motion by Claud Newcomb and a second by Bryan Frank.

Pastor's Report:

Mileage of 316.4 miles for July in the amount of \$221.48. Old Business:

Water tests will get done. Chris will contact the water softener company and see where we should go from there.

Pastor Chris will be out of the office on October 16th (Fall Break) and October 26th (Brethren Way).

The wiring has been roughed in for the new sign. Duke Energy will get the pole installed. Tentative sign installation is August 26th.

Richard Monce was elected as an Elder of the Church.

Refresh and Rekindle Ministries will come on September 21st to speak to the church.

They are working on the wheelchair lift.

They are working on a quote for the smoke detectors.

The outdoor camera quotes came in. It was decided to wait until 2026 to look into this again.

The company from the sound system withdrew their bid, we will look into checking with someone else. Tami mentioned Todd Miller with SoundVision in Wabash.

The Pastor's Report was approved with a motion by Donna Harman and a second by Carol Krom

New Business:

Announcements will be put back in the worship order August 24th. We have one person being baptized August 24th and another person who wants to join the church.

Pastor Chris wanted the Board aware of some help that has been given and more issues have arisen.

There was a discussion on combining the Benevolence and Outreach Committees. The Chairmen will discuss with their committee members and decide. They would still keep two separate money accounts.

Rena' needs a new computer and it was decided on a motion from Brian Chamberlain and a second with Jeff Warnock that Pastor Chris could pick her out a computer up to \$1500.

The Elders will be "the nominating committee" and find new recruits for the 2026 Board for those going off.

Benevolence:

Aaron Mattern reported his committee needs to meet to figure out guidelines for assisting others.

Program Committee:

Bryan Frank reported there will be Church in the grove on 8/31/25 with Meghan Brock. Movie night will be September 21st. Movie will be announced later.

Outreach Committee:

Richard Monce reported the Prayer Tent Ministry is continuing on Wednesdays. The Community Breakfast is the last Saturday morning a month. There were 17 good blood donations at the August Blood Drive. October will be Trunk or Treat.

Worship:

Claud Newcomb reported they served 49 Communion in August. They are looking into purchasing new communion linens.

Trustee Report:

Northeast corner of the church floor was wet. Aaron Mattern called Edwin to have it looked at. The water softener was cracked and there was a leak. The softener had to be replaced.

Aaron will check on the furnace contract and fire extinguisher quote.

A motion to approve the committee reports was given by Claud Newcomb with a second from Bryan Frank.

We have bell tower quotes that will need to be discussed. \$2800 to fix the roof leak and brace the tower, or \$8900 to remove it and possibly have more expenses from this.
