

Urbana Yoke Parish Board Minutes September 2025

The Urbana Yoke Parish Board met on Wednesday, September 10 for their monthly meeting. Claud Newcomb opened the meeting with prayer. Board chairman Aaron Mattern called the meeting to order.

The Secretary's Report submitted by Tami Overman was presented and approved with a motion by Carol Krom and seconded by Donna Harman.

The Treasurer's Report was presented and approved with a motion by Claud Newcomb. It was seconded by Richard Monce.

Pastor Chris's Report:

Mileage total 44.8 miles for August for the amount of \$31.36. Old Business:

Time off or away: Chris will be taking a week off September 29th through the 5th of October. Therefore, we will need a guest speaker to fill those two Sundays. Pastor Chris has asked Kelly Beutler to fill one of those Sundays.

He will also be out of the office on October 26th to attend the Spiritual Director for Men's Weekend for the Brethren Way of Christ.

We are waiting for Duke Energy to install the pole before the sign can be installed. That is currently scheduled for September 25th through September 29th . Sign is tentatively scheduled for installation for October 2nd . The sign company (Baldus) has asked for us to pay the rest of invoice except for installation fee which is \$2.000.00 A motion was made by Claud Newcomb to wait until the sign was installed and then checked for any details that need to be worked out before payment in full. Carol Krom seconded the motion.

Refresh and Rekindle Ministries will have Terri Hinds coming to speak at the church on September 21st.

Desirae Handrich was baptized on August 24th at Kevin and Jolene's Baer's pond.

Rena's new computer has been purchased and they are finishing up setting it up. In New Business for Pastor's Report: Chris has a new member who has agreed to go to Brethren Way of Christ. He asked, if he needed, may use the church funds to sponsor this person since there is a fund set up for this. Board agreed this would be okay. Along with Brian Chamberlain asked about sponsoring three more people to go to Brethren Way. This was approved.

Continuing with new business by the pastor: Chris has been doing way more than his pastoral duties for several months now. He has handed off most of these to the trustees. The following will be under the trustee's duties. Wheel chair lift, smoke detectors, water quality, security cameras, and other building issues of the church. Chris will be keeping IT type things and the sign installation contact and details. Other new business:

A request was received by the church to make a donation for the street lights in Urbana. In the past this has been paid by Jeff Biehl (Cornerstone Vet) for the use of parking in the former church parking lot. A motion was made by Brian Chamberlain to make a payment of \$100.00 to the Urbana street light fund. The motion was seconded by Claud Newcomb.

It was asked about reseeding the area where the ground was dug up for installation for the electrical lines for the new sign. Aaron Matter said he had the equipment to do that easily.

The two units that needed to be installed to improve our water quality has been installed. The water needs to be tested again to be sure everything is doing what it is supposed to do.

Committee Reports:

Benevolence: Aaron Mattern reported that his committee donated \$500.00 to Kole Adamiec who is fighting his fourth battle with neuroblastoma cancer.

Aaron brought the wheel chair ramp back to the church. If anyone is need of borrowing it contact Aaron. Aaron reported they do have a few packages of sausage left. Richard Monce asked if that could be donated to the Largo food pantry. It will be donated to the food pantry.

Program Committee:

Bryan Franks reported that the church in the grove was well attended. There were 73 people. There will be a couple movie nights coming up. One on September 21. The movie will be War Room. The second movie will be New Year's Eve, December 31st. Movie -The Forge.

Outreach Committee:

Richard Monce reported they will stop the prayer tent ministry in September. In the three months of having the tent available, only two people had come for prayer. However, through that, we did gain a church family. The Saturday breakfast; do we want to continue with that? The same two families come each Saturday but we have not gained people into the congregation. The pizza day went well, a big thank you to Dominos for supplying the pizza.

Worship: Claud Newcomb reported they served communion to 49 people for the first Sunday in September.

Trustee Report:

Aaron Mattern replaced the furnace filter. Aaron will have the Clearwater company who installed the two new unties to check the water.
