Hello.

When you hear that your heart will be pierced, what comes to your mind?

What images does that conjure?

Do you imagine a sword fight like in a Robin Hood: Prince of thieves scene?

Do you imagine a scene from a romantic movie or book?

Or do you imagine something like open heart surgery?

I ask this question, because I am sitting here reviewing the Christmas story found in Luke 2. I get to the part in verses 34 and 35 that says:

"34 Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, 35 so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too." (NIV)

I find it curious that it is mentioned right after explaining that Jesus will cause the thoughts of many hearts to be revealed. Then he mentioned a sword will pierce their hearts.

I wonder were Mary and Joseph concerned? Did it trouble them to hear it? Did they truly comprehend what Simeon meant? In verse 33 it says they marveled at what was said about Jesus. I imagine they are in the temple courts smiling as everyone is admiring their baby. Then Simeon said those words. What were they thinking? Did they keep politely smiling? Did their smile turn to a frown? Or were they just overcome with joy, that they couldn't help but smile even in the midst of this prophecy.

This one little detail gives me pause to ask so many questions. The answer to these questions lies in what did Simeon mean when he said "a sword will pierce your own soul too."

What do you think he meant?

In the coming year, I want to challenge you to read the bible in this kind of detail. To ask these questions and think about them.

I ask this because we should not read the bible to just complete a task for the day. We should read the bible to seek the Face of God. One way to do that is to read His love letter (i.e. the bible) and ponder its meaning.
