



2023 January Urbana Yoke Parish Church Board Minutes

The Urbana Yoke Parish Board met on Wednesday, January 11, 2023. The meeting was called to order by board chairman Chris Hann. Ed Fitch opened the meeting with prayer.

Secretary's Report: The December minutes were reviewed and approved as read by a motion from Aaron Matter and seconded by Steve Runkel.

Treasurer's Report was accepted by a motion from Aaron Mattern and seconded by Jim Hartley.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Pastor Larry reported that the worship will be a little different than we have been doing for the last several months. The hymns and Pastor Larry's scripture, will no longer be on the overhead screen. Therefore, we will be using the songbooks from the pew racks. And, we encourage the congregation to bring their Bible and turn to the scripture for the worship time.

Committee Reports:

Benevolence - Aaron gave this report. The committee has the plans set in motion for the annual sausage sales. He will be contacting The Paper to place an ad for this event. Sausage sales will be held on February 4th, at the church, with pick up on the west side of the building.

The committee has dispensed the budgeted amount for the year, to nine different organizations of Wabash County, and one family who needed assistance. With that amount being \$500 to each.

<u>Christian Ed</u> – This committee is the Sunday school teachers, Mary Earle and Brian Chamberlain. The Elders also serve on this committee. The elders are Brian Chamberlain, Ed Fitch, Claud Newcomb and Barry Swanquist.

Outreach – Donna Harman reported the gifts for the angel tree had been delivered to the family by Tanner and Sydney Chamberlain. Sydney had one of the children in her classroom and suggested the family for our church Christmas project. Thank you to Tanner and Sydney for your helping hands.

Old Business: It was brought up at the December board meeting that a checkbook for the Speicher Cemetery was in the name of Urbana United Methodist Church which no longer exists. The board members agreed this account needs to be changed. This will be done through the Beacon Credit Union. A motion was made by Brian Chamberlain and seconded by Ed Fitch that the church board recommends this be changed over to Speicher Cemetery. John and Judy Elzroth whose names are on the board for this cemetery, will be the ones who can make that change through Beacon. Beacon has requested a copy of the church board meeting to show that we have requested this change. Therefore, this report will be submitted to them.

New Business: Several have ask for offering envelopes for the year. Rena' said she will order those as needed. In other new business. the board agreed to keep the same officers in 2023 as were in 2022. Board President - Chis Hann, Vice – Aaron Mattern who will also continue as treasurer, and Donna Harman secretary. A motion was made by Jim Hartley and seconded by John Elzroth to accept these officers for 2023. And one more item of business, John and Judy Elzroth have served on the Speicher Cemetery for many years and feel it is time for them to step down. Therefore, two new board members are needed. The requirement is that you be a part of the Speicher family (because the land for the cemetery was donated by that family) and that you be a member of the Urbana Yoke Parish Church.


