I love the season of Lent.

This year is especially meaningful because Lent started about as early as it possibly can and, with this early start, brought an early spring.

Other than enjoying the weather being unseasonably warm, we as a congregation have been looking at a vision statement that calls us to be a place that helps build strong faith, strong relationships, and strong communities. This vision statement the Lord is leading us into requires us to be people who are fully dependent on him.

Now, I realize a statement that sounds like that might cause you to ask, "How in the world do I fully rely on God?" That's a great question and where I believe the season of Lent really comes into play. During Lent, we look at ways we can be renewed in our faith by practicing repentance and self-denial. These two spiritual disciplines are accessible to us as Christians through prayer.

Prayer is one of the two major focuses in the first priority of our vision-to be a place that helps build strong faith. I have been spending a good deal of time talking with many of you about how important prayer is and how we are reminded that prayer is more about a relationship than it is about a transaction. We pray in hopes of communicating with our creator, God.

But how do we know whether what we are praying actually matters or that God even listens? I suggest that these questions are great ways to point us back to Scripture, where we see how God responds to his people when they pray.



Jesus, in the Gospel of John chapter 17, shows us what it looks like to pray even when it seems like God isn't listening. Notice what he does: He keeps it simple by praying for himself (1-5), for those closest to him (6-19), and for all who might come to believe in him (20-26). He keeps it real by sharing what is at the forefront of his mind without making up a bunch of fancy words and thoughts but staying on point. Finally, he keeps up praying. Rather than saying, "God I don't really want to do this, help me out," Jesus keeps praying to the point that in Luke 22 we read, "And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground."

Now, is the Lord asking you and I to pray so deliberately and earnestly that we would be to the point of sweating blood? I don't think that's the case, but we do read Paul's exhortation in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17 to, "Pray without ceasing."

There are so many great ways to be part of prayer ministry here at Morningside Lutheran! As I write this, a new group is kicking-off meeting on the 1st Wednesday of the month from 5-5:45 to pray for this church and all who gather here for worship and praise. Another meaningful experience that I would like to invite you to consider is our prayer vigil that takes place on Good Friday from 7:30pm

to midnight in our sanctuary. You are invited to spend 30 minutes in the stillness of the sanctuary to simply pray. It might be a great way for you to practice meeting with God in a real way that also prepares your heart and mind for the Easter celebration in the coming days. Sign-up sheets will be out in the Foyer Starting Sunday March 17th.

May God bless you as you seek him in prayer!


