• By reading from four separate places in the Scripture every day, you should be able to better grasp the unity of the Scriptures, as well as enjoy the variety of seeing four different viewpoints.

• You can begin at any point of the year.


• To prevent the frustration of falling behind, which most of us tend to do when following a Bible reading plan, each month of this plan gives you only twenty-five readings. Since you'll have several "free days" each month, you could set aside Sundays to either not read at all or to catch up on any readings you may have missed in the past week.

• If you finish the month's readings by the twenty-fifth, you could use the final days of the month to study the passages that challenged or intrigued you.

• If reading through the entire Bible in one year looms as too large a task, you can alter the plan to meet your needs. For example, you could read the gospels and the wisdom books this year, and the other two categories next year.

In the year ahead, ask God each day to speak directly to you from the Scripture portions you read. Be expectant, and let your continual exposure to God's Word reshape your attitudes and behavior as you gain a better understanding of every part of His written testimony to us.

### Starting Over – Again

### Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. (Psalm 51:10, NRSV)

The arrival of a new year is often a time to reflect on the past. This year will mark thirty-two years since I finished my schooling and began my ministry as an ordained pastor. One thing I miss about school is the fresh start the beginning of each new school year gave me. It was a chance to regroup and start over with renewed enthusiasm. The average work situation, where one day flows into another and one year passes seamlessly into the next, rarely allows us the chance to stop and catch a needed breath before moving onto the next task.

Having said that, all of us have a chance to make a fresh start in at least one aspect of life no matter where we are in life's journey. 1 John 1:9 says, "If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." God doesn't just forgive our sins; He treats us as if they never happened in the first place. God gives us a fresh start in our relationship with Him in an act of incredible grace. We can apply the same grace to our broken relationships with others.

If you truly want a fresh start in a relationships that has been damaged by sin, you also need to remember something that the apostle Paul wrote: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, I strain to reach the end of the race and receive the prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us up to heaven (Philippians 3:13-14, NLT). We experience fresh starts in our lives and our relationships when we forgive what has happened in the past and move forward into the future free from the burdens of resentment and filled with grace and mercy toward others.

### from Pastor Ron, Session Moderator

In preparation for calling a Senior Pastor, your session is finalizing our Church Profile. This public document will be used to inspire potential Senior Pastor candidates to consider a call to CPC.

Your Session is considering partnering with a consulting firm that would move our search process from one that is somewhat passive to one that is proactive. Many churches put their info "out there" and wait for pastors who are looking to move to apply. This passive approach really does not work that well and often takes longer than it needs to. With a consulting firm, like the one we are considering, they will reach out to pastors who may not even be looking but who could be a great fit. Those candidates will be invited to prayerfully consider if God, in fact, may be calling them elsewhere, maybe even to CPC.

The other benefit is that this particular firm is highly connected to our denomination, ECO (A Covenant Order of Presbyterians) as well as other reformed bodies, one being a sister denomination, EPC (Evangelical Presbyterian Church) which holds similar biblical positions and ministry values. Therefore, this firm will be able to reach a broader scope of candidates and can vet candidates well, only presenting good solid pastors for our PNC (Pastor Nominating Committee) to interview.

The Session is collecting suggestions that you may have for the PNC. If you have someone in mind (self-referrals welcome) please give that name and reason(s) you think, he or she would be a great addition to our search process. He or she must be a CPC covenant partner (member). The session will prayerfully consider all suggested names and present a slate to the congregation made up of some elders currently on session, a deacon and two or three from your suggestions. This slate will be voted on at a congregational meeting in late February.
