Our Bereavement Ministry focuses on memorial services and funerals held at our church. It involves being present for the families to answer questions, give directions, and show compassion.

Another focus is food – fellowship time on Sunday morning and other events in the life of the church. We prepare beverages and set out refreshments before and after each service and to clean up afterwards. We owe a debt of gratitude to Bob & Donna Gates for their faithfulness to this ministry. The deacons also prepare the elements for communion, clean up, and ensure that the homebound receive communion monthly or as needed. We are always looking for people who are willing to serve. Prayer Corner

PRAYER IS FILLING THE GAS TANK

I drive a rather old care with 130,000 miles on it - a big car that "floats" down the highway. I don't like the newer SUVs. They ride too hard. It may be fashionable to drive them, but I am old enough that I don't need to be fashionable. I can say I like to

float rather than bounce down the highway. I really don't care what other people say.

Imagine that it's Sunday morning about ten minutes before worship time at your church and that I'm going to be preaching there. You notice me pushing a big old car down the road. It dawns on you that I am the guest preacher, and it's clear that I'm never going to arrive on time. I'm right in front of an open gas station about a five minute drive from the church and I'm passing the station! You slam on your brakes, hop out of the car, and ask me, "What's the matter? Why are you pushing your car?"

I brush some perspiration of my forehead and reply that my car happens to be out of gas.

"Why, then, are you pushing it past the gas station?" you ask. "Push it into the station, and fill it up!"

"But," I protest, I'don't have time to stop for gas. I have only ten minutes left to get to church. I can't be distracted by anything. I must be on my way!" My reply is so foolish that it's hard to comprehend. No one in his right mind would be too busy to fill up if he were out of gas. No one would push his car past a gas station because he was in a hurry to get somewhere.

Think of this illustration whenever you want a good example of a prayerless Christian. The vast majority of Christians in our society claim they don't have time to pray. But that excuse is as senseless as my saying I don't have time to stop and fill my gas tank.

Prayer is the relationship in which we stop, right where we are, and are filled with the Holy Spirit. Without Him we can do nothing. "Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me" (John 15:4). Just as a branch apart from the life of the vine is fruitless, so we are empty apart from the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit. Although the Spirit of God si given to every believer upon being born again—for there is never new life apart from His presence-there are many descriptions of being filled with the Holy Spirit in exceptional ways (see Luke 1:15; 4:1; Acts 2:4; 4:8, 31; 7:55; 11:24; 13:9, 52). The distinction made in all these passages-namely, that these people were filled with the Holy Spirit—is a distinction over other Christians who had the Holy Spirit but did not give evidence of that kind of filling.

Prayer Corner

We are called to cooperate with the Holy Spirit, neither resisting nor grieving Him, so that every aspect of our being may surrender to and be saturated with His holy presence.

The Holy Spirit's power flows into us during regular times of prayer and praise. Jesus told us, as we will see in more detail later in this book, that we are to be "yoked" to Him-and when that happens, His power flows into us (see Mat. 11:29-30). The "yoke" of which He speaks is the "yoke" of prayer.

Prayer, then, so far more than merely a relationship, even more than a dependent relationship upon God. It is a relationship of empowerment. In simple language, ti is the time when our spiritual gas tank is filled with the power of the Spirit of God.


PRAYER IS FILLING THE GAS TANK REFLECT/DISCUSS:

Why does CPC host Red Cross Blood Drives?

We host Red Cross Blood Drives to provide a place in the West Valley for people to donate. We typically host drives on a Saturday so working people have an opportunity to donate.

Why donate blood?

Science has not yet been able to replicate human blood. Blood and blood products are vital for survival. Every three seconds someone needs a blood transfusion. The only way they can receive a transfusion is from blood donors.

Why volunteer to help with blood drives even if you can't donate?

"Many hands make light work." There are things that happen behind the scenes before, during, and after a blood drive. No one person can do it alone. Volunteer positions include: recruiting donors; clearing the auditorium before the drive; greeting & registering donors; monitoring the canteen & thanking donors; clean up & reset the auditorium after the drive for Sunday worship.
