Dear CPC family,

I love celebrating July 4th!

I am proud of this country and all it stands for. Yes, we have blemishes on our past, and yes, it is easy to criticize our government. But the ideals we were founded upon are still priceless and I would rather live here than any of the other 38 countries I have visited.

This year, we honor the wisdom and courage of our founding fathers who signed the Declaration of Independence 249 years ago.

By the way, did you know that the only pastor to sign the Declaration, John Witherspoon, was a Presbyterian pastor, and the president of what became Princeton University?

The most famous words of the Declaration are still inspiring today:

"We hold these truths to be selfevident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of happiness."

This is the foundation of our country and our society. We must never let go of this simple statement if we are to remain a strong country.

But these words are not universally true. They are true for a nation as we order our life together and declare our core values. They are not true, however, in our spiritual lives. What do I mean?

Life is not an unalienable right. God owes us nothing. Life is His gracious gift. The breathe you are taking right now is a gift of God. Getting up in the morning is His gift. We should be constantly and forever grateful to the core of our being.

When we confuse political rights with spiritual truths we become spoiled and entitled spiritually.

Likewise, while Liberty may be an inalienable right from the perspective of human government, again, true Freedom is a gift from God. It is only a human right because we should not seek to take from another person what God has freely given them.

Not only are Life and Liberty gifts of God rather than rights, we are not to use our Freedom to abuse how we use this life. Freedom always has limits. As Christians we know that all God's gifts are meant for God's glory and as a blessing to the world around us. They are not merely for our own personal happiness.

And that leads us to remember that the pursuit of happiness should never be the goal of life as some people have made it. It is the result of a Life well lived, using our Liberty as God intended.

So this 4th of July: Be grateful for all God's gifts, including this nation; Serve one another, using the Freedom God has bestowed on us; Pray for our country and our leaders to live up to our ideals; and Honor this country, but honor God first and foremost.

Prayer Corner

Why Pray?

For the Christian, praying is supposed to be like breathing, easier to do than to not do. We pray for a variety of reasons. For one thing, prayer is. form of serving God (Luke 2:36-38) and obeying Him. We pray because God commands us to pray. (Philippians 4:6-7) Prayer is exemplified to us by Christ and the early church (Mark 1:35; Acts 1:14; 2:42; 3:1; 4:23-31, 6:4; 13:1-3). If Jesus thought it worthwhile we should also.

Another reason to pray is that God intends prayer to be the means of obtaining His solutions in a number of situations. We pray in preparation for major decisions (Luke 6:12-13); to overcome demonic barriers (Matt 17:14-21); to gather workers fir the spiritual harvest (Luke 10:2); to gain strength to overcome temptation (Matt 26:41) and to obtain the means of strengthening others spiritually (Ephesians 6:18-19).

We come to God with our specific requests, and we have God's promise that our prayers are not in vain, even if we do not receive specifically what we ask for (Matthew 6:6; Romans 8:26-27). He has promised that when we ask for things that are in accordance with His will, He will give us what we ask for (1 John 5:14-15). Sometimes He delays His answers, according to His wisdom and for the benefit in these situations, we are to be diligent and persistent prayer. (Matthew 7:7; Luke 18:1-8). Prayer should not be seen as our means of getting God to do OUR will on earth, but rather as a means of getting God's will done on earth. God's wisdon far exceeds our own.

For situations in which we do not know God's will specifically, prayer is a means of discerning His will (See James 1:5). Prayer was instrumental in the Spirit's sending Paul and Barnabas on the first missionary journey (Acts 13:1-3). Solomon asked for "wisdom and knowledge" and God gave him that and much more (2 Chronicles 1:10-12).

Prayers un-prayed will be unanswered. If Syrian women with the demon influenced daughter had not prayed to Christ, her daughter would not been made whole (Mark 7:26-30). If the blind man outside Jericho had not called out to Christ, he would have remained blind (Luke 18:35-43). God has said that we often go without because we do not ask (James 4:2). In one sense, prayer is like sharing the Gospel with people. We do not know who will respond to the message of the Gospel until we share it. In the same way, we will never see results of answered prayer unless we pray.

A lack of prayer demonstrates a lack of faith and a lack of trust in God's Word. We pray to demonstrate our faith in God, that He will do as He has promised in His Word and bless our lives abundantly more than we could ask or hope for Ephesians 3:20). Prayer is our primary means to see God work in others' lives. Because it is our means of plugging into" God's power, it is our means of defeating Satan and his armythat we are powerless to overcome ourselves. Therefore, may God findus often before His throne, for we have His promise that the fervent prayer of a righteous man accomplishes much (James 5:16-18) May God glorify His name in outlives, as we believe in Him enough to come to Him often in prayer.
