## Camp T-Shirt

Please indicate the appropriate size on the registration form and include \$15 with your registration deposit. Camp shirt preorders end 4 days before the start of camp. A limited quantity of shirts may be available for sale at camp at the on-site rate of \$20.

## Camp Store and Snack Shack (Garage)

The Camp Store features t-shirts, hats, water bottles, journals, pens, and more! The Snack Shack, also known as the Garage, features bottled water, sports drinks, soda, chips, ice cream, candy, nachos, and more! We suggest campers bring a minimum of \$20-\$25 to spend on merchandise and snacks.

## Family Discount

There is a sibling discount of \$10 off the second, third, fourth, or more camper from the same immediate family. Family discounts are not available for walk-ons.

The Early Bird Rate ends 3 weeks before the start of camp. The Regular Rate ends at midnight 5 days before the start of camp. Registration includes a \$30 non-refundable deposit which is deducted from the tuition. Non-Assemblies of God churches please call (515) 276-5493 for rates.

## **Age Policy**

The age policy is designed according to both the spiritual and physiological needs of campers. The Iowa Ministry Network feels it is in the best interest of the students that their camp experiences be synonymous with their normalized experiences; the normalized experiences being the public or private schools where they are currently involved. The minimum and maximum grade levels required at each camp refer to the grade they will attend in the **Fall of 2020**. Kids Camp is for grades 3-6.

## **Medical Disclaimer and Camp Code of Conduct**

All campers are required to have a legal guardian sign a medical disclaimer in order to attend camp. This disclaimer, also known as the parental authorization form, will be emailed to you after completing the online registration. You can also download it from the Iowa Ministry Network website or get a hard copy from your church's camp coordinator. Once you have completed and signed your camper's authorization form, turn it in to your church's camp coordinator. Campers will be asked to sign a code of conduct form when they arrive to camp. The code of conduct is congruent with what campers would experience in school or in the student ministries of a local church.

## **Visitor Policy**

Our Visitor policy is designed for the protection of all campers. No visitors (other than relatives and pastors) will be allowed on campus. All visitors must check-in and check-out with the camp manager or an individual approved by the camp manager. In order to receive approval for your visit, please email [adam@imnag.org](mailto:adam@imnag.org) with your name, phone number, and the camper(s) you wish to visit at least 24 hours prior to visiting day. Visiting day is Tuesday only from 6:30 PM until cabin time.

## **Health Policy: Lice Checks and Medication**

It is always our number one priority to protect your campers and to help promote a healthy camp environment. Our policy prohibits anyone with head lice to be admitted to camp. Each church should inspect campers for lice 14 days prior to attendance and again on departure day. Students on campus with lice will be sent home.

All medication is required to be turned in to the camp first aid personnel at registration. This policy includes all counselors and/or volunteers approved to room with students. Any medication being sent with a camper will need to be entered on your camper's online registration along with dispensation instructions. The camp first aid personnel will be responsible for dispensing all medications.

Prescriptions and over the counter medications are required to be in their original prescription bottle or container with the dosage and instructions still intact. Please place all prescriptions and medications in a ziplock bag with the camper's name, the church name and city, number of medications, and medication times. ## **Early Pick-Up Policy (and picking up a sick camper)**

No camper is allowed to leave the campgrounds without the proper procedure, including legal guardian consent. The only individuals allowed to pick-up a camper are his or her legal guardian or emergency contact. Please inform your church leader well in advance (if possible) if you intend to pick-up your camper early.
