Joint Reformation Service

Reformation Day commemorates Dr. Martin Luther's posting of his Ninety-Five Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany on October 31, 1517. This act triggered the movement in world history known as the Reformation. Martin Luther and his colleagues came to understand that if we sinners had to earn salvation by our own merits and good works, we would be lost and completely without hope. But through the working of the Holy Spirit, the reformers rediscovered the gospel - the wonderful news that Jesus Christ lived, died, and rose again to redeem and justify us.

The Sermon isn't the finish line for the Ministry of the Word; it's the starting line. Proclaiming Christ begins in the pulpit, but then it must continue through the life of the church as members echo God's Word back and forth to one another.
