### *Make a Tuffet*

**Description:** In the first class, using your selected fabrics, you will construct the fabric skin for your tuffet. In the second class, you will complete the tuffet and take home a finished project ready to attach your choice of feet. Make more for grandchildren, holiday gifts and yourself.

**Length:** 6 hours (morning Fri and morning Sat)

**Hand/Machine:** machine on Fri; hand on Sat

**Skill Level:** Ability to maintain a consistent seam allowance. All straight seam sewing.

**Kit Cost:** \$49

**Kit Description:** All materials necessary for completion except for ruler, pattern and feet. Make your choice of feet at a DIY store to attach later.

**Total Cost (Class + Kit):** \$124


**Day/Time:** Friday, 9-12 and Saturday 9-12

**Student to Bring:** First class on Friday: General sewing supplies; Individual 18"x24" cutting mat and rotary cutter; twenty-four 3" strips in your choice of colors for body of tuffet; 15 degree ruler (available for purchase in class); Pattern – "Quick and Cute Tuffets" by Erin Underwood designs (available for purchase in class)

**Second class on Sat:** Five inch square to cover button and staple gun with 3/8" staples

**Instructor Bio:** Debbie Allen is an owner and instructor at The Polka Dot Pincushion. She guarantees that you will love your tuffet when you are finished and have lots of fun making it!



### **Skill Level Definitions:**

**Beginner-** An easy project suitable for a quilter just starting out. To build quilting skills, good beginner skills include basic seaming, 4-Patch squares, and other simple piecing projects

**Intermediate-** An intermediate quilter may have mastered more skills than a beginner or novice but still not be ready for advanced quilting techniques. Some intermediate quilting skills include simple free-motion quilting, piecing, and needle-turn applique work.

**Advanced-** Advanced quilting techniques include needle-turn applique work, curved piecing, feathers, and complicated free-motion quilting. Advanced quilters may also be ready to design their own quilts or work free-hand on more complicated designs.
