Lately, I've been having a recurring question running through my mind – "Do you/ they really want it?" I suppose it stems from the idea that if people really want to make something work for themselves, it will happen.

For example, the student works really hard for his/her degree. A couple saves and saves so they can enjoy a vacation, or a new car, or a downpayment on a house. Parents scrimp and get extra work to send their children to Christian school

and get extra work to send their children to Christian school.

I think you get the picture. If you want it bad enough, you'll pray fervantly, you'll save, you'll jump through hoops, you'll work really hard, you'll lose sleep. All of this so that you can have what you really want (within God's will, of course!).

Now apply that to you'r country. We just celebrated Canada Day. And, I assume, that we are happy and proud to be part of this great country. We know it isn't perfect. But is it worth saving? Do you want this country to be as great to future generations as it was and is to you? Are you going to stand up for it? Or are you going to stand by as it falls to some ungodly ideology?

And apply that to your church. There are many people doing many things in the church, and they are to be thanked! But are we falling on our knees and pleading with God to keep it vibrant? Are we putting our all into the church, like our parents and grandparents did? Do we really want to see the church thrive? Or do we want to "ride the wave?"

The answer lands with each of us, I suppose. Remember the words of Joshua, "But if serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your ancestors served beyond the Euphrates, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." (Joshua 24:15)
