Council News from October 8, 2025

- Council is sending a thank-you card to an anonymous donor who generously gave a gift to be shared among churches that provide community meals. We were blessed to receive \$1,000 to support our Community Meals Ministry—a tremendous and timely blessing. We are deeply grateful for this generous support that helps us to continue serving our community.
- 2. Council will be responding to seven key questions at their November meeting. These responses will be compiled with those from other churches in our Classis and shared with Classis Quinte. The collective insights will then be brought forward to the Ecclesiastical Gathering of Canadian CRCs. The questions focus on the unique challenges and opportunities facing Canadian CRC Churches today.
- 3. Council spent time going through a Pastor Evaluation Survey at the end of their meeting. The executive will meet with Pastor Tim to go over the results.
- 4. A time of Mutual Censure was shared by all.
- 5. Pastor Tim and the officiating Elder will be at each of the exit doors following the service. They are available to pray with anyone who would like to share a concern, need, or moment of thanksgiving. Please feel free to approach them if you'd like someone to pray with you.
- 6. The Annual Yearbook Numbers will be submitted by the October 16, 2025 deadline.
- 7. Our next Council Meeting is Wednesday, November 12, 2025.
