

Current Wording

Bylaws - Article I - Staff and Officers

Section I. Board of Elders: The Board of Elders shall consist of a five-man board, with one member being elected each year for a term of five years. No person shall serve on the Board of Elders more than one term without at least one year intervening. Three years or more shall be considered as a full term. The Board of Elders shall be authorized to approve the use of the Church facilities as requested for special occasions without the necessity of bringing the matter before the Church for approval.

Amended

Bylaws - Article I - Staff and Officers

Section I. Board of Elders: The Board of Elders shall consist of the paid pastor(s) and a minimum of three male elders selected from the church membership five man board, with one elder being elected each year for a term of three five years. Every nominee must be affirmed by the congregation prior to a new three-year term. After serving two consecutive terms, the elected elder shall take a one-year break. The total number of elected elders may be increased at the discretion of the actively serving board. No person shall serve on the Board of Elders more than one term without at least one year intervening. Three years or more shall be considered as a full term. The Board of Elders shall be authorized to approve the use of the Church facilities as requested for special occasions without the necessity of bringing the matter before the Church for approval.

Constitution - Article VI - Duties of Officers

Section III: Duties of the Board of Elders: The Board of Elders shall, in every way, assist the Pastor in his work. It shall cooperate with him in providing the pulpit supply and the leaders of prayer meetings in his absence. It shall cooperate with the Pastor in visiting the members and in the care of the sick, the needy, and distressed members of the Church, and in the preparation for the observance of the ordinances of the Church. It shall assist in promoting the evangelistic program of the Church. The Board of Elders shall be authorized to approve the use of the Church facilities as requested for special occasions without the necessity of bringing the matter before the Church for approval.
