## Missions Spotlight

In Hebrews 11 we find a list of the great heroes of the faith. While you and I may never make such a list, by following the lead of God in our lives somewhere today, one of us might just touch the life of someone that will become the next Billy Graham. Someone we invite to Sunday school might become the parents of a child that grows up to become a great missionary or pastor that leads many souls to Jesus Christ.

In 1934 two teenage boys heard about the tent Revival in Charlotte, NC being conducted by the great revivalist of that day, Mordecai Ham, and decided they wanted to go. After spending 10-15 minutes looking over the vast tent area and not finding two seats together, decided to leave.
