Why Missions?

Matthew 28: 18-20; Mark 16:15; Acts 1:8

The common theme in each of these verses is “when you have received the Holy Spirit, you will have the power, and you are to take that power unto all the world and be a witness of Jesus Christ. What he gave direct to the twelve, through the power of preaching the Word of God that same power has been passed onto you.

When men and women place their faith in God through Jesus Christ, they are empowered to do things they never thought they were capable of.
