7 Dominant Domains

While IRBC's model of counseling takes into account the fact that a large number of counseling problems are rooted in personal, sinful behaviors (in the *Spiritual Domain*) and severe, organic problems (such as organ damage and related dysfunctions in the *Bodily Domain*), we believe that counselors are wise to evaluate five other areas as well. Thus, we speak of the *7 Dominant Domains of Origin for Human Problems™*:

The Spiritual Domain™

The Mental Domain™

The Emotional Domain™

The Social Domain™

The Bodily Domain™

The Environmental Domain™

The Production Domain™

After identifying variables within the domains which have contributed to counselees' problems, God's truth is then practically applied in such a way as to minister to them holistically.

What to Expect: This is an eight month course which is divided into two semesters. During the first semester, you will watch recorded lectures delivered by Dr. Jim Newheiser (of the Institute



for Biblical Counseling and Discipleship). During the second semester, students will watch recorded lectures delivered by Dr. Doll and other IRBC speakers;

you will also watch counseling observation videos, so that you can "get a feel" for what a Biblical counseling session is like. While watching those observation sessions, students are taught to take notes in a 7DD Data Collecting and Goal Form, in order to practice both note-taking skills and thinking comprehensively about the problems people experience. You will meet monthly for discussion.



To fulfill the requirements for the course, you will need to attend the monthly seminars, wherein you will discuss relevant counseling topics. Outside of class, you will have weekly homework assignments that consist of reading assigned chapters of books or articles, and viewing assigned lectures online. You will need internet access.

Completion at a certificate awarding ceremony. While this certificate is not a counseling credential, it does fulfill the basic training and observation requirements needed for Phase 1 of the IRBC certification process. Phases 2 and 3 involve taking theology and counseling exams, and engaging in 50 hours of supervised counseling.
