

Pastor's Corner:

When I became the Minister of Christian Education at First Baptist Church of Hightstown, (1977-1982), the pastoral staff was expected to become involved in various clubs and organizations in town. Even though I was single, I ran for the East Windsor School Board, which provided a fantastic experience and a lot of knowledge about the educational political structure of the town. Halso became a member of the Rotary International club of Hightstown. The club had weekly meetings and when one could not attend the local meetings, one had to go to a different meeting in a nearby town. Other church members were involved in similar clubs, and I found that these clubs had more stringent membership requirements than area churches. Baptist churches uphold membership as of the utmost importance. We give a certificate of membership which reads: "Upon the profession of her faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, Redeemed Sinner was baptized in the fellowship of the First Baptist Church of Christ's Kingdom Town." Baptism is an act that is done individually but incorporates you in a fellowship of believers. In addition to the certificate of baptism, the church issues a certificate of membership which reads, "This is to certify that Redeemed Sinner was received into the membership of the First Baptist Church of kingdom Town on this date."

In the United States, one of the first protests of the Baptists was against the taxation of residents for the church and clergy. Initially, Baptists preferred to be jailed rather than pay taxes to support the state church, such as the case of Isaac Backus and his mother in Massachusetts. However, the Baptists required adults upon their baptism to unite with the church, become members, and support the church's work financially.

In my pastoral life I encountered some oddities. The first was that in some of the churches that I served, some of the members would say, "Pastor, this is your church"! I pointed to the verse that says that the universal church belongs to Jesus Christ and the local church belongs to Christ and to us as members of the body of Christ. Secondly, we had people who wanted to become members of the church, but they did not want to be baptized. They liked everything about us, except that we required a believer's baptism to become a member. One particular person was baptized after about 8 years of regularly attending our church. Another person attended regularly but refused to become a

member. She came from a church that did not require membership or financial contributions. One of the arguments was that she does not need papers to prove things, however, she needed papers to prove that she was married to her husband, papers to prove that her three children belonged to her, and papers to prove that she was the owner of her house. At one point I asked her if we as the local body of believers can count on her. The membership is a declaration that Christ and the local church can count on you – we can count on your presence, your gifts, and your willingness to become one of us. You declare allegiance to this body.


