

# Pastor's Corner "God's Gifts to Build the Church – Pastors"

- Teachers" (September 21st, 2025)

Ephesians 4:7-13: But to each one of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore, it is said, 'When he ascended on high, he made captivity itself captive; he gave gifts to his people.' (When it says 'He ascended' what does it mean but that he also 'descended' into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.)

The gifts that he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ."

I have learned how to "pastor" or "shepherd" by observing other people. I knew all the classic biblical passages – "David was called from sheep to tend to the people of Israel." Jesus was the Good Shepherd. He taught about good shepherds and the bad ones. The bad shepherds are hired, and then they leave the sheep alone when the flock is in danger. Jesus as the Good Shepherd gives his life for the sheep. The sheep know the voice of the Shepherd, and they follow him. In addition to these biblical verses, Romanian culture is a shepherd's culture. As American culture is full of cowboys, our culture is full of shepherds and sheep. There are many important Romanian stories and poems about the relationship between shepherds and their sheep. Our own expanded family always had a shepherd or two.

On a metaphorical level, I also had examples of good shepherds as I grew up. The local Orthodox priest one winter stopped me on the street to tell me that a hat on my head will serve me well, even though on that day, I did not wear one. When I was 16 and in the First Romanian Baptist Church in Detroit, Rev. ASL treated me as his son in the Lord and encouraged me to become a pastor. When I traveled to Wellesley, Mass. the Pastor of the church, Robert Decker, told us that he is not a great preacher, but he will teach us to become good shepherds.

As with the responsibility that comes with being a teacher, the shepherd's responsibility is beautiful and frightening. Apostle Peter tells us that as shepherds we are going to give an account for the sheep that God has entrusted to us. That is an awesome responsibility.

I have seen great shepherds, and I have also seen church members make a shipwreck of their faith because they refused to be shepherded. Psalm 23 writes, "Thy rod and thy staff they comfort me" but do they? Do we all respond well to being "shepherded?"

In one of my churches, I had a member who, by his bodily posture during the worship service, declared that I am not his teacher or his shepherd. His outward demeanor antagonized the whole church until I went to his home, and I asked if I was his shepherd. He told me that I was not, and some 20 years later he still had not found a church or a pastor where he was satisfied and willing to submit to being guided.
