A reflection by Pastor George:

On Sunday afternoons while I drive home from church, I often listen to a radio program entitled "From the Top." It features gifted high school musicians between the ages of 16-18 who have won prestigious competitions and are on their way to attending famous music schools. I marvel at and enjoy their prodigious talents. I remember that I myself am not gifted musically, but I am still encouraged to be among those described in that verse "let everything that has breath, praise the Lord" (Psalm 150).

In theology we have the expression, "theology from below and theology from above." Theology from below is when we humans imagine how God looks and we "anthropomorphize" (make God to look like us — "Anthropos") Him. Theology from above is God revealing Himself to us in all His glory and telling us that He is beyond comparison; there is no one with whom we can compare Him in His essence, virtues, and glory.

The story of Christmas brings me to what is one of my favorite Christmas songs, "I Wonder as I Wander." In my own wandering I have gained a better grasp of our humanity. I have parents and siblings and friends, and I understand us, the Homo Sapiens, the ones created by God. What I do not understand is how the "uncreated," the Eternal God, comes to be one of us. I have read many times when Paul writes that Jesus Christ being the form of God, did not consider His equality with God as something to be grasped, clanged to, but humbled Himself and became one of us (Philippians 2:6-11). He became one of us without losing who He is in His divinity – from the top, He came to the bottom. Yet, at the

In His Image Justice Coalition (IHIJC) is closing out 2022 with thanksgiving to God! We had an extremely successful 8th annual Walk for Freedom, with well

over 100 people in attendance. Pastor Geralda of St. Paul's UMC, who hosted the walk, is meeting with our leadership to help facilitate ongoing connections between our ministry and the church/community in Willingboro. Judi and Erin Worgess attended International Christian Alliance against Prostitution's (ICAP's) triennial conference in Green Lake Wisconsin, with training sessions, connections, and lots of encouragement. IHIJC received its first grant from Investor's Bank, and will be using monies received for education through billboards. IHIJC speakers gave a presentation to RCBC's students in November, and the RCBC Graphic Design class created posters and brochures for us designed to appeal to youth. We were also able to help a survivor with some urgent, practical needs this month, thanks to the generosity of God's people!

We ask for your prayers as we applied for a second grant for community education. Our team averages 3-4 presentation/month including local high schools. We also have visits to businesses and hotels planned to provide the employees with info to identify and report human trafficking.


