Curriculum is consistent with our Biblical worldview. All subjects are taught with an emphasis on how they relate to God's plan for the world.

2. Classical

Our approach to education is based on the time-honored tradition of classical education, which has been proven over centuries to produce individuals who are well-rounded, intellectually curious, and able to think critically. Our curriculum is designed to be rigorous, yet accessible, and to instill in our students a love of learning that will last a lifetime. Classical education is aimed at developing virtue and character, and that students should be challenged to think deeply and to engage with the great ideas and works of Western civilization. Group instructors tutor from diverse classical curriculum. Education is not merely accumulating knowledge, but growing in wisdom (how to apply knowledge) and virtue (how to apply knowledge with moral excellence).

3. Conservative

We are committed to providing an education that is grounded in the principles of Western civilization, which are based on a respect for individual liberty, personal responsibility, and the rule of law. Our curriculum emphasizes the importance of logic, reason, critical thinking, and systematic philosophy. We seek to instill in our students a sense of respect for the great thinkers and leaders who have shaped our world. We're educating with a fidelity to truth; *that is:* We're working to conserve our Christian and American Heritage.

As a ministry of New Chapel, the doctrine and convictions of our cooperative are guarded by the elders of the church. This ensures that students are discipled according to God's Word. We are committed to providing an education consistent with the Biblical mandate of both the church and parents. Scripturally, **God ordained only two institutions for the training of children**. He ordained **the home** (in Ephesians 6:1-4) and He ordained **the church** (in Matthew 19:14; 28:20; John 21:15). As such, Christian schooling is a <u>supplement not a replacement</u> for the discipleship training of children by parents. We believe this collaboration, in the form of a Christian Education and schooling, is key to developing our young people to grow in their faith and understanding of God's plan for their lives. We believe it is <u>crucial</u> to preserve our Christian heritage.

5. Culture of Excellence

We are committed to both **academic and spiritual excellence** through a comprehensive curriculum, while encouraging imagination and promoting the development of body, mind, and soul.

6. Community of Families

We believe that **parents have the primary role in a child's education**, **discipleship**, **and growth**. Therefore, we are a community of families who are involved and invested in the life of our school.

7. Cost-Affordable

We believe that a **high-quality education should be accessible** to everyone, regardless of their financial situation. As a result, we offer financial aid and scholarships to families who are a good fit for our school and who need assistance to cover the cost of tuition. Three Bedrock Principles

Our Foundational Commitments in Christian Education

Three Bedrock Principles: Our foundational commitments in Christian Education

1. We champion the commitment to partnership between the home and the church.

God has ordained only two institutions for the training of children: The Home (*Ephesians 6:1-4*) **and The Church** (*Matthew 19:14; 28:20; John 21:15*). The church and home must cooperate to effectively train your child. The greatest damage we can do to children is to submit them to divided authority. As the Bible says in Amos 3:3, "Can two walk together except they be agreed?" – and I Corinthians 1:10, "Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment."

Our Partnership is defined as a mutually supportive, cooperative, and engaging relationship between parents and our School.

At the same time, Chapelton is not led through democracy.

We recognize that while we may take the lead in educating your child in curricular and cocurricular endeavors, you are primarily responsible for your child's spiritual education and growth as well as the development of your child's fundamental character. We are allies and partners; however, you are the parents. We respect and assist your role as parents to prayerfully lead, guide, and direct your family in wisdom. As the junior partner, it must be noted that we have many kids from many homes with multiple systems of upbringing. Without systematic clarity, divided authority can be a source of confusion for students and families. As we work together toward molding children who are both academically and spiritually strong, we ask that you remember and commit to the following partnership requirements and expectations of Chapelton.

All parties in this partnership must commit to Christ-like character in our interactions. We are committed to partnering with you and helping students develop a faith of their own amidst social and cultural pressure. We are committed to a vibrant partnership with parents by providing resources, support, and community to aid the growth and development of their children.

We are a discipleship school which means your support is required in:

1A: Doctrinal Matters

• Expect us to teach sound Christian doctrine and advance a Christian worldview throughout our academics and activities. See our Statement of Faith.

- We expect you to uphold and advance our "Statement of Faith," Biblical concepts of discipline and moral integrity, and to faithfully attend New Chapel or another Biblebelieving church with your child.
- Any disagreements with minor doctrinal issues should not be vocalized publicly.

1B: Standards of Behavior

- Discipline introduces us to the foundational principle of following Christ: "If any of you wants to be My follower, you must give up your own way, take up your cross, and follow Me." (Matthew 16:24 NLT) The word "discipline" is from the Latin word "disciplina" meaning "instruction and training." It is derived from the root word "discere"- "to learn." Simply put, discipline is to study, learn, train, and apply a system of standards.
- We will not permit students to violate standards of behavior with impunity.
- We will monitor behavior and actions of students and enforce appropriate standards of behavior through non-punitive and punitive actions if necessary.
- We ask you to monitor your child's behavior and assist in enforcing standards of behavior consistent with the Chapelton Honor Agreement, as the primary deliverers of punitive actions for repeated poor choices.

1C: Relational Questions, Conflict, and Differences

- Appropriate and timely communication is king! We agree to conduct dealings with all in a civil, Christ-like manner. As partners, we agree to deal directly with each other on all Chapelton-related matters.
- Please do not seek answers, air frustrations, question policy, action, or protocol on Chapelton related matters on social media. Please do not "vent" strife, gossip, to others publicly or online. Such behavior erodes trust and destroys relationships.
- In the spirit of Matthew 18, any concerns or criticisms are to be dealt with by involving the appropriate parties directly. This could be <u>school-to-parent</u>, <u>parent-to-school</u>, or <u>parent-to-parent</u>. We will discuss concerns regarding your child with younot other parents.

1D: Financial Integrity

We will operate with fiscal integrity and return value for investment. We expect you
to stay current on tuition payments and communicate honestly with the office
regarding the status of payments. You will not be required to participate in
fundraising activities or to assume any financial burden relating to the school other
than tuition and appropriate activity fees.

Three Bedrock Principles: Our foundational commitments in Christian Education

2. All concerned parties must do their part in pursuit of academic excellence.

- Combinations of classical, experiential, and project-based methods are experienced daily. Content acquisition in conjunction with critical thinking processes are emphasized. Students are encouraged to think creatively and critically, become problem solvers, and performers. We work diligently to enable students in the discovery and development of their God-given talents and to prepare them for a lifetime of learning, serving, and honoring God.
- At Chapelton, pursuing academic excellence is combined with the development of
 intellectual capacities and skills. We invest in the gifts and talents of our students. We
 help them find opportunities to discover, develop, and deploy those gifts and talents in:
 our school, their home church, the Church at large, and the world.
- Chapelton will provide academically rigorous, challenging courses, and programs.
 Homework may be part of that (not unreasonable amounts but enough to support the content taught). We expect you to monitor your child's academic performance, assist them as needed.
- A commitment to Christ-like character speaks directly to Academic Integrity. <u>Like you</u>,
 we aspire to teach kids to do what is right even when it is hard. This includes all forms
 of academic honesty in the educational setting.

Three Bedrock Principles: Our foundational commitments in Christian Education

3. Students should have a co-curricular pursuit.

It is important that kids experience age-appropriate competitive and performance-based opportunities as available. Why?

- By serving at church, and/or being on a team, students discover what it means to serve. "God has given each of you a gift from His great variety of spiritual gifts. Use them well to serve one another." (1 Peter 4:10 NLT) **The body of Christ is a team.** Shared experiences create lasting bonds.
- What we are a part of is greater than the part "I" play. We finish what we start: We do not quit.
- We expect parents to ensure students attend required practices and events, and to comply with rules of the activity with honor, dignity, and class.

About Classical Education

Chapelton Christian Preparatory School holds academic fidelity in a rich tradition of education which has blessed God's people for thousands of years.

Classical Christian education affirms that Christians must fulfill the command given by God in Ephesians 6:4, "Bring them [children] up in the discipline and instruction [Paideia] of the

in Ephesians 6:4, "Bring them [children] up in the discipline and instruction [Paideia] of the Lord." The "paideia of the Lord" is instruction in all of life with the Lord as the center, and giver of all knowledge. Therefore, at Chapelton Christian Preparatory School, all subjects are taught as part of an integrated whole with Scripture at the center.

Learning, indeed, is not compartmentalized; rather all subjects should be integrated as to give a deeper and broader understanding. Students learn how literature, history, science and theology are related. Students are shown how all knowledge ultimately points back to God, the Creator of all things. The selection of subjects of a classical school will also be focused so they can be taught with depth and integration.

Classical teachers model a Biblical Christian life. They encourage each student to begin and develop a relationship with God through Jesus by the Spirit. They have a love for learning and a passion to teach students as they say, "Follow me as I follow Christ."

Classical Christian education encourages all students to develop a lifelong love for learning and attain their academic potential. They are challenged with the great books of western civilization, theology, philosophy, and history. They learn to analyze books through the lens of the Biblical worldview. Books are curated in such a way to cultivate the mind and train them in virtue.

Classical Christian education utilizes the "<u>trivium</u>" (a word to encompass the progression through grammar, logic and rhetoric). Utilizing this process of integration in all subjects enables students to leverage God-given strengths (displayed in children throughout the different stages of their life) that can be capitalized upon. This not only helps in the gaining of knowledge but also teaches students the **process of learning** for the future, as subjects are taught from the foundation up.

> The purpose for Classical Christian Education:

The purpose of Classical Christian Education is to cultivate wisdom and virtue in students. It will grant them knowledge and inspire them to love the Lord through what they read and how they are taught, helping students become disciplined, responsible and virtuous adults. Classical Christian education will be a superior foundation in the student's preparation for college or a career, although its focus is to produce a student who exemplifies a life of wisdom and virtue.

> The "Trivium" explained:

In classical Christian education, students move through the stages of <u>grammar</u>, <u>logic</u>, and <u>rhetoric</u>. This progression is known as the "trivium." It utilizes the child's development as it systematically helps the child not only to learn but it gives the student the tools to learn

in the future. The trivium works by building on a foundation. Everything to be mastered has the rules or foundational information (grammar), how to utilize the rules properly (logic) and how to be eloquent in the use of that information (rhetoric). In moving through the trivium, students are given the tools to learn for themselves while mastering the skills necessary to be thoughtful, contributing members of society.

How does classical trivium relate to a student's grade in school?

Grades K-4 deal with: "Who/ What/ Where/ When"

Grades 5-8 deal with: "Why"
Grades 9-12 deal with: "How"

In classical education, the elements (grammar, logic, rhetoric) of the trivium are designed to match certain stages of child development.

>> Grades K-4: Grammar: "Who/ What/ Where/ When"

In the **grammar** stage, children love to chant, memorize and recite. Education in the grammar stage is fact-based. This stage is not simply linguistic, but rather the basis of all subjects. The goal is to equip students with the foundational building blocks of education. Example: The grammar of math would be arithmetic and the times tables.

>> Grades 5-8: Logic: "Why"

In the **logic** stage, children become curious and interested in argumentation, wanting to know, "How come?" Therefore, Chapelton teaches discernment and distinctions. Students begin to apply logic as they evaluate argumentation and learn to view information critically. For an example, Wilson writes, "To see that a horse is not a duck belongs to the grammar stage. To see that a horse is a suitable animal to use in battle, and that a duck is not, belongs to the dialectic (logic) stage."

>> Grades 9-12: Rhetoric: "How"

In the **rhetoric** stage, children are concerned with appearances and how they're seen by others around them. They are taught how to present themselves – why something matters and how to best apply the two previous stages of learning.

About Learning Latin:

One subject which is more peculiar to classical education is the study of Latin. It's been said, "Latin promotes mental discipline; it encourages literary appreciation; it leads to a mastery of English; it provides a solid foundation for preparation for Christian ministry."

Latin is a precise language which takes discipline to learn. We understand that, "Long experience has shown us that the discipline required for learning another language, particularly Latin, is a discipline peculiarly suited for application elsewhere." Learning Latin helps students to better understand English grammar. Latin has the added bonus that it is the basis of many of the early great works of theology, classic literature, as well as science and medicine.

2025-2026 Vision

We're taking the journey to make Chapelton everything God has called her to be. It's clear that God has blessed Chapelton as a cooperative. We want to build on that. We see Chapelton eventually becoming a five-day weekly Christian school. On the journey toward that, we are committed to taking the next steps. The 2025-2026 School Year will see Chapelton expand to three days.

✓ We are keeping a weekly homeschool cooperative day.

As Chapelton grows, we want to ensure there's a place for our homeschool families to engage. Our cooperative day for 2025-2026 is Tuesday. Homeschool students and Chapelton Full-Time students will integrate for cooperative classes.

- ✓ **We are expanding to offer three days of K-8 education.**While homeschool cooperative students will only attend one day, Chapelton Full-Time students will attend three days (Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday).
- ✓ **High-School Aged young people are welcome.**As a step toward high-school level education, we are offering a "Scholars Cohort" as a supplement to homeschool families. This will take place on our Tuesday cooperative day. Wednesday will feature a "Practicum" where students will teach, serve, engage independent study, and the like.
- √ K-8 families will be provided curriculum for Thursday and Friday.


"CrossSeven" is an online tool to help you (and your child) fully utilize Claritas Curriculum.

Chapelton Christian Preparatory School **Doctrinal Statement**

The Bible: We believe the Bible is the inspired, infallible, authoritative Word of God, without error in the original languages.

The Trinity: We believe that there is only one God and that He is eternally existent in three persons- Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The Deity of Jesus Christ: We believe in the deity of Jesus Christ, His virgin birth, His sinless life, His miracles, His vicarious and atoning death, His resurrection, His complete conquest over the powers of Satan, His ascension to the right hand of the Father, and His imminent return in like manner as He went away.

Salvation: We believe that the new birth is essential for salvation and that this salvation is wholly by grace through faith.

The Church: We believe the church consists of all those who truly believe in Jesus Christ and in His atoning death, and who trust in Him as their personal Lord and Savior.

The Holy Spirit: We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit and His Gifts, by whose indwelling, born-again Christians are enabled to live Godly lives.

Baptism and Holy Communion: We believe in baptism in the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We also believe in the ordinance of Holy Communion.
