### Pastor's Letter

Rev. Jeremiah Johnson

"What Did You Do This Summer?"

Its August ... already. No doubt in a few short weeks, someone will ask you, "so what did *you* do this summer?" Well, if you've been around Glory of Christ this past summer, the answer would be, "a lot!" Granted, summer does slow things down a little bit around here, but it's still a busy place. So even though summer isn't *quite* over yet, I thought it would be helpful to look back at what we *have* been doing this summer.

#### **VBS**

You know summer has arrived when hordes of children descend upon the church, wearing tie-dyed t-shirts and wielding Frisbees. Yes, it's Vacation Bible School! This year, we continued on our multi-year journey through the Bible with *Out of Egypt I Called My Son*, our own home-grown VBS that took us from the birth of Moses to the far side of the Red Sea. With interactive storytelling, songs, and crafts, we re-lived God's dramatic rescue of the Israelites from Egypt. And more importantly, we saw how this miraculous rescue pointed us ahead to our even greater rescue from our bondage to sin by Christ's death on the cross.

#### Gloria Christi

Music has always served the church as a way to accompany the Gospel and draw out its beauty. Here at Glory of Christ, we believe that church music is for everyone, from the toddler just learning to sing "Lord have mercy," to the most seasoned adult who is up to the challenge of Bach's most difficult music. With this in mind, Gloria Christi, our church music camp, was back for another year with *Magnificat!*, based on Mary's song from Luke 2. Young students from Glory of Christ as well as other congregations joined together each day to learn and grow in musicianship and the Lord's Word. The week culminated as our students sang for the Divine Service on Sunday and magnified the Lord with instruments and song.

#### **Higher Things**

Every year, our youth sojourn together with hundreds of other Lutheran teenagers to a gathering that we know as Higher Things. There, they are immersed in beautiful worship, solid teaching, and engaging workshops, all firmly rooted in the Lord's word. They also manage to have a bit of fun while they're at it. (Did you see the pictures?) This year, Pastor Krueger and Kelly Dorweiler took six of our youth to Concordia University in Mequon, Wisconsin. The theme of the gathering this year was *Concordia*, unity within the church. It was a fantastic trip, notwithstanding the near-brush with a funnel cloud.

#### Wednesday mornings

Many of our activities may go on hiatus during the summer, but not Wednesday mornings! Every Wednesday begins at 9:15 with a brief service where we've been traveling through the Psalter, one psalm at a time. We've already been through the whole book once, and we've started again! Then, at 10:00, Bible Class begins. We've been trekking through 1 and 2 Samuel. We've re-visited all the stories you covered in Sunday School as well as the ones that probably never made it into the curriculum.

#### Youth group

Our VBS offering this year was donated to New Life crisis pregnancy center. In addition to all the diapers we collected, our youth group took the offering and purchased all kinds of baby supplies, including car seats, strollers, wipes, and cribs. Then we loaded it all up into cars and took it down to Richfield to present the gifts to them there. Later this month, the youth group will be welcoming in the new sixth graders at the annual pool party at Pastor Johnson's house. I'm certain Pastor Kruger will help us all remember our baptism as he does an epic cannonball into the deep end.

#### And more...

So many other things continue during the summer, including hospital visits and services at Cherrywood and Sunday morning Bible Class and planning for the rest of the year. But above all, the one thing that provides the constant rhythm and beat in the church is the Divine Service. In His infinite wisdom, the Lord gave us a *weekly* Sabbath. Seasons may come and go, our schedules evolve, and our lives are always changing, but the Lord gives us the one thing needful week after week after week. We always need His name, His forgiveness, His guidance, His rebuke, His mercy, His supper, and His blessing. So the Lord is here *every* week, always giving what we need the most. And that's why *we're* here too.

That's what we did this summer.

#### Summary of Results:

- General offerings are \$2.6k favorable to budget for the month and are \$(20.8)k unfavorable YTD 2019.
- Silent Auction Receipts (MissionFest) are S(6.6)k unfavorable YTD as not all pledges made during MissionFest were yet received.
- Designated Funds applied and corresponding designated expenses pertain to the purchase of Orff instruments for use in Gloria Christi music camp and in youth music.
   Funds were approved to be spent by the council in April 2019.
- Education expenses for the month and YTD are favorable due to VBS and Sunday School expenses coming in under budget.
- G&A expenses are favorable YTD due to timing of photo directory expenses.
- Missions funded in June were Concordia Theological Seminary Klemet Preus Scholarship Fund. Missions YTD are unfavorable to budget due to timing of Mexico Mission expenses.
- Occupancy expenses are favorable to budget for the month due to decreased utility expenses and in-line with budget YTD.
- Pastoral expenses were favorable in June due to the timing of health reimbursement expenses. This is also driving the YTD unfavorable result.
- Net Operating Income of \$3.9k was favorable to budget by \$6.7k for the month of June 2019. When including non-cash depreciation charges, Net Comprehensive loss of \$(8.3)k was \$(6.7)k unfavorable to budget for month of June 2019.
- Net Operating Loss of \$(25.1)k was unfavorable to budget by \$(38.1)k YTD for 2019. When including non-cash depreciation charges, Net Comprehensive loss of \$(98.3)k was \$(38.1)k unfavorable to budget YTD for 2019.


