Pastor's Letter

Rev. Jeremiah Johnson

2018 in *Preview*

It looks like 2018 is shaping up to be a pretty exciting year. Of course, the best things in the church never change. Jesus will still come each and every Sunday to forgive sinners. He will keep on feeding you His flesh and blood. And your baptism won't wear off this year. But there will be more good things coming our way.

The Building

You've all been remarkably patient with the mess, but our construction project is almost complete. Soon, we'll be able to fill all the additional classrooms, spread out in the new, expanded fellowship hall, cook in an upgraded kitchen, and converse in the fireside room. We are currently still on schedule to finish by the end of January and move in sometime in February. As you can imagine, moving all the stuff back into the church is no small task, so if you can lend a hand, please sign up on the sheet in the Sanctuary.

Capital Campaign

As of today, we have received pledges just shy of \$900,000 towards the capital campaign, and praise God that we have already received over \$700,000! That will put our mortgage for the new building just around 1.7 million. If you haven't made a pledge yet or you'd like to increase yours, it's not too late. our campaign runs all the way through 2019, and there are still pledge forms in the back of the church. We want everyone to be able to play along!

Sunday School

Instructing our children in the faith is one of the most important things we do as the church. But with all the classrooms torn up, we've had to put Sunday School on pause for a few months. But after we get back into the building, Sunday School will be starting again soon with plenty of space for everyone. So it will be time to jump-start that habit of sticking around for the education hour after church again. Habits are powerful things. Sometimes the bad ones seem hard to stop and the good ones seem hard to start. But Sunday School is a habit worth having. Make 2018 the year that you start Sunday School as an every week habit.

Music

Luther famously said that “music is the handmaiden to theology.” Music, of course, is not the gospel itself, but it is a language that speaks to our hearts and expresses the beauty of God's love for us. We at Glory of Christ have been enormously blessed with so many members who lend their talents to the Divine Service for the glory of God. Like many other areas in the church, the construction has put a damper on some of our music programs for a little while. Adult choir, bells, and brass have all been operating pretty normally, whereas our other ensembles have been put on the back burner. And as much as we'd love to be able to have business as usual, this natural “pause” in our music programs has given us an opportunity to reflect on music here at Glory of Christ.

Perhaps it goes without saying, but I'll say it anyway. Music in the church always serves a purpose. Concerts and performances are fine things, but in the church, our music is always the vehicle for the Gospel. This is, for example, why our choir sits in the back and our musicians are generally out of sight. Our music should always point to Jesus and not us.

And like most worthwhile things, music takes work. You can't just sit down at a piano for the first time and expect to play Rachmaninoff. You need to be taught. It's the same with church music. For this reason, we'll be redoubling our efforts with children's music. We don't have a lot of specifics yet, but stay tuned for changes to children's choir and chimes and Sunday School.

Mexico

As you're probably aware, we are in the middle of a multi-year commitment to our Synod's work with the Lutheran Synod of Mexico. Lutheranism has never had a strong presence in Mexico, but our work began in 1940, and by 1968, the Lutheran Synod of Mexico became a partner church of the LCMS. Pastoral formation fell on hard times in the 2000s, and in 2015, the Lutheran Synod of Mexico reached out to us, especially for assistance in training new pastors. Since we began our support of the mission in Mexico, we have supported four missionaries, the current two, Pastors Conrad and Schlund, are longer-term missionaries who are providing training and ongoing support to the students who are currently studying to be pastors. The eventual goal is to help the Lutheran Synod of Mexico re-establish a permanent program for pastoral training and in the words of Pastor Conrad, “work ourselves out of a job.”

Both of our missionaries are based out of Mexico City, and as part of our work, we will be sponsoring a short-term work trip there over Memorial Day weekend this year. Although not all the details have been worked out yet, some of our activities will include doing some general repair and maintenance of one of the church buildings, working with the local musicians, and simply providing Christian encouragement to our brothers and sisters who are there.

And more...

Of course, the list for 2018 goes on: Liturgy Workshop, Noah's Ark VBS, Missionfest, Bible Class, and more. It's a great time to be here at Glory of Christ—the Lord has blessed us with so much to do. And in the center of it all is Christ. In Him all the things that we are and do hold together.



Worship this Month

The Baptism of Our Lord **January 7, 2018 – Mark 1:4-11**

“You must honor Baptism and esteem it glorious on account of the Word, since He Himself has honored it both by words and deeds; moreover, confirmed it with miracles from heaven. For do you think it was a jest that, when Christ was baptized, the heavens were opened, and the Holy Ghost descended visibly, and everything was divine glory and majesty? Therefore, I exhort again that these two, the water and the Word, by no means be separated from one another and parted. For if the Word is separated from it, the water is the same as that with which the servant cooks, and may indeed be called a bath-keeper's baptism. But when it is added, as God has ordained, it is a Sacrament, and is called Christ-baptism.”

-Luther's Large Catechism, Holy Baptism

Second Sunday After Epiphany **January 14, 2018 – John 1:43-51**

“We hold these truths to be self-evident...” Thus the second paragraph of the Declaration of Independence begins. But when Philip, upon recognizing Jesus to be the Messiah, invites Nathaniel to “come and see,” he is not inviting Nathaniel to witness a self-evident truth. The true identity and work of Jesus is something that can only be *believed*. Nor is it self-evident when God speaks directly to Samuel in the temple (our Old Testament lesson today). *Three times* Samuel mistakes the voice of Eli for the voice of God.

And nor are the truths that we proclaim here in the church self-evident. It is not as if when we confess the Christian faith that anyone is compelled to smack themselves on the forehead and cry out, “of course—it all makes sense!” On the contrary, it takes divine intervention to believe. Samuel needed God to call on him, and Nathaniel only believed after encountering the Son of God himself. And we too need God Himself to send the Spirit so that we might believe these truths, which are anything but self-evident.

Third Sunday After Epiphany **January 21, 2017 – Mark 1:14-20**

Those first disciples were called to be fishers of men in a very public sense. They were the first pastors of the church. They were called to preach, that is, to cast the net of the gospel. After Jesus' ascension they and their successors established churches throughout the world. Schools of fish were brought into the nets, and into the ark of the Christian church. And while everyone is called to faith, and while each believer must be continually caught in the net, not all are called to be pastors. You are, however, part of the crew the priesthood of all believers. While it's not your task to preach the gospel publicly in worship, you can share privately the hope that is within you, when given the opportunity.

**Fourth Sunday After Epiphany
January 28, 2018 – Mark 1:21-28**

“Authority”

Twice the crowds marvel at Jesus' authority: the first as he teaches them and the second as he drives out an unclean spirit. But these are not two different authorities. Jesus came to unseat the powers of darkness that rule our present age. When Jesus healed the paralytics and forgave the sinners and raised the dead and cast out demons, these were all part of the whole cloth of his reign. Jesus' authority is not merely to *declare* us free from the powers of sin and death, but to actually *free* us, driving back the evil that infects this fallen world. Jesus does not come only with a promise of salvation. But He comes with *authority* to bring that promise to fulfillment.

- Silent Auction Receipts (gross) are favorable to plan by \$6.1k.
- Education expenses trending favorable YTD due to VBS expenses being substantially less than budgeted due to shortened VBS program for 2017.
- G&A expenses are trending unfavorable to budget YTD due to the expensing of construction soft costs.
- Occupancy expense is trending favorable for November and YTD due to the inclusion of a mortgage payment and additional depreciation expense in the 2017 budget which have not yet been recognized.
- Non-cash depreciation expense is included in the "Occupancy" expense line item above. Total YTD Depreciation expense was \$34.8k. See cash basis net income presented above.
