Greg Finke founder of Dwelling 1:14 talks about two missional environments, five missional practices, and five missional questions.

Two Environments:

1) Missional Neighboring

2) Missional Communities

The Five Missional Practices:

- 1) Seeking the Kingdom (discovering what God is *already* doing in your community)
- 2) Listening to Jesus (what is God telling you)
- 3) Talking with People
- 4) Doing Good
- 5) Ministering through Prayer

The Five Missional Questions:

- 1) How have you seen God at work in your life and in your missional neighborhood(s) this last week? What's He up to and how can you join Him?
- 2) What is God teaching you through His Word and in your life experience? How is God "messing" with you? What's He saying to you: assuring you? ...comforting you? ...convicting you? ...nudging you? ...challenging you? ...inviting you?
- 3) What conversations are you having with people outside your normal circle(s), especially pre-Christian people?
- 4) What good can you/we do today? Who needs a blessing? What are you doing about it?
- 5) For whom are you praying, particularly pre-Christians? How can we support you in prayer?



Loving People to Jesus

What Is a Missional Neighborhood?

Missional Neighborhoods are the neighborhoods and the environments, in which we live, work, and play and they include all the people that we meet within them. These are the people we meet or have an opportunity to meet on a fairly regular basis. They are the places in which, and the people with whom, we strive consistently and regularly to live out the five missional practices.

What Is a Missional Community?

A Missional Community is not a typical small group Bible study, rather it is small group that meets to support and encourage one another in and for missional living (living out the missional practices) in our everyday lives. The time together is spent in sharing *God stories* as group members consider the five missional questions: (1) Where/how you seen or experienced God recently in your neighborhood, at work, or in your social/recreational settings? We want to join God in what He is already doing. (2) What has God been saying and communicating to you in life and *particularly* in and through His Word? (3) With whom are you having conversations and enjoying relationship (particularly *those* without a community of faith)? (4) Where or with whom have you had or do you have the opportunity to do good, to be a blessing, to make a difference? (5) For whom are you praying (again, particularly those without a community of faith? In a missional community we support, encourage and lovingly hold one another accountable for living missionally in our neighborhoods, our places of work, and our social and recreational settings.

Looking for a Missional Neighborhood?

Missional neighborhoods come in many forms (the people living close to your home, the people with whom you work or go to school, the people at your recreation or health center, the list goes on and on). However, in <u>addition</u> to those people with whom you normally live, work, and play...

BROOKVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL – Point Person, Bill Cullen (815) 713-7072

Mt. Olive Lutheran Church has partnered with Brookview Elementary School, through Kids Hope USA, to make a positive impact on the lives of children at Brookview. - On the third Monday of each month our congregation provides lunch for approximately 100 people at Carpenter's Place.
- On the fourth Friday of each month we lead a chapel service.

We regularly make contributions of donated items (everything from clothes, to furniture, to toiletries.

There is also opportunity teach a Bible class, help with inventorying donations, collecting donations, or simply befriending the guests at Carpenter's Place-offering them encouragement and support. + Mt. Olive's Board of Outreach asks all Boards, Standing Committees, and Bible study groups to adopt one of Mt. Olive's four focus outreach ministries listed above as one of their missional neighborhoods. We ask Boards, Committees, and Bible study groups at least twice/year to be a tangible presence of God and blessing of God in their chose focus missional neighborhood.

What Does It Mean to Adopt a Focus Ministry as a Missional Neighborhood

- 1. A "missional neighborhood" is a grouping of people that you as an individual, as a missional community, as a group (e.g. a Board, a Committee, a Bible study group), or an organization (e.g. Mt. Olive Lutheran Church) believe God has given you for you to invest your time, talents, and treasurers that you might be a blessing and an expression of God's love. (John 13:34-35; John 15:16-17; James 4:17; 1 John 3:16-18; 1 John 4:7-21)
- 2. Think of your focus neighborhood through the lens of Finke's five missional questions/practices. (1) What is God already doing in the neighborhood? (2) What is God telling/showing you in the Scriptures about serving the neighborhood? (3) With whom are you talking/forming relationship(s) in the neighborhood? (4) What opportunity do you have to be a blessing in the neighborhood? (5) How are you praying for the neighborhood?
- 3. Being a blessing and an expression of God's love can take many forms (everything from helping a little old lady carry her groceries to telling someone about how Jesus died for the sins of all humankind and rose again to offer all people a new and eternal life in Him).
- 4. Being a blessing to people almost always begins with listening to them and discovering their need(s). Jesus would frequently ask people He encountered, "What do you want me to do for you?" (Matthew 20:32; Mark 10:36; Mark 10:51; Luke 18:41; John 5:6 Note: Jesus would ask this question not because He didn't know, but to bring clarity to and for the asker). Listen! Observe! Respond!
- 5. As an individual and/or as a group ask "What can I/we do to be a blessing?" Then look and listen for opportunities. Ask those you seek to serve "What can I/we do to be a blessing in your life?
- 6. Some specific ideas:
 - Send greeting cards: Christmas cards, Valentines card, Easter cards, birthday cards, etc.
 - Buy winter gloves, scarfs, sweaters, and/or coats.
 - Buy school supplies: paper, pencils, erasers, color markers, rulers, backpacks, etc.
 - Arrange for and/or conduct clothing drives, food drives, etc.
 - Get on the mailing list/newsletter list of the service organization through which they frequently will express their most felt and immediate needs.
 - Volunteer at RRM Thrift Store.
 - Inventory donations for Carpenter's place.
 - Serve as a mentor or prayer partner at Brookview school and/or get involved in the other events we do their (contact Bill Cullen for a list)
 - Provide money for Carpenter's Place lunches
 - Help serve lunch at Carpenter's Place
 - We always provide a sack dinner the 1st Sunday of the year at RRM, you might want to arrange for doing another time as well
 - David Roskowic leads chapel at Carpenter's Place the 4th Friday of the month, go with him and visit with the "guests" who come ("guests" is what Carpenter's Place calls those they seek to serve).
 - The 3rd Monday of each month we provide lunch at Carpenter and also help serve it. We might also eat and visit with the "guests" there. Perhaps you might select a "guest" or two and take them out to lunch.
 - Offer to lead a Bible study at Carpenter's Place
 - Talk with Alyssa Newton about providing food for Youth for Christ weekly meetings and/or helping with their weekly meetings as a participant
 - Be a "big brother" or "big sister" to/for a youth from Youth for Christ
 - Be an emergency shelter home for a youth from Youth for Christ
 - Buy Bibles and give them to those you serve. Perhaps make an index of particular passages and insert it in the front of the Bibles or perhaps highlight certain passages in the Bibles.
 - Ask leaders of the service organizations for names of individuals who are in need of comfort, encouragement, etc., then write them (perhaps on a regular basis) an encouraging letter or an encouragement card. Include an encouraging bible verse.

The opportunities to be a blessing are endless. If we take time to listen and observe both the individuals we are seeking to serve and the organizational leaders, the opportunities to serve will become increasingly evident.

EACH ONE REACH ONE

Our Board of Outreach would like to introduce an **EACH ONE** REACH **ONE** campaign and to have the concept of **EACH ONE REACH ONE** become a part of the DNA of Mt. Olive and Concordia Lutheran Churches. **Each One** Reach **One** is to help us develop and enact a missional mindset and to add an element of intentionality to our love, care, and witness to people in our lives.

Jesus tells us in John 13:34-35 "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (NIV) and our congregation's mission statement is summed up in the words "Loving People to Jesus." Love is what Christianity is all about and what we strive to be about here at Mt. Olive.

We all want people to know and to experience God's love incarnate in the person and work of Jesus. Jesus in John 15:16-17 says, "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit--fruit that will last.... This is my command: Love each other."

Although we may not be able to make a difference in the lives of everyone we encounter, each of us can make a difference in someone's life. *EACH ONE REACH ONE* is an effort to help us make that difference. We are asking all of our members to identify two families (one family within our fellowship here at Mt. Olive and one family that is unchurched) with whom they very intentionally and consistent will strive to communicate God's love for the people, for them. Naturally, we would pray that you would love everyone you encounter, but in the busyness of your life we are asking that you make a very concerted effort through word and deed to love the people in the two families you identify.

Greg Finke has developed a tool (see reverse side) you might find helpful as you strive to love the families you identified. He calls it our "Five Point Friend."

Monthly the Board of Outreach will suggest an idea or two that you might consider as you strive to meaningfully love the families you have identified.

Gary Chapman has identified five "love languages." He believes that everyone has a primary way (language) through which they hear/experience love. The five languages he suggests are: (1) words of affirmation, (2) quality time, (3) acts of service, (4) gifts, and (5) physical touch. If you can, learn the love language of the members of the families your have identified and then in the days, months, years ahead share your love and God's love through <u>their</u> love language.

We are excited to see what God is going to do as together we make this concert effort to love.

May God be with you as we **EACH** strive to **REACH ONE** with the love of Jesus.



 What is something you can do to show your friend love in a tangible way?


48 Pages of Select Bible Passages

Page 10-57 are 48 one-page selections of Bible passages. (Page 9 is a generic study guide) Each page is meant to be used independent of the other pages for personal reflection and group discussion. These one-page reflection sheets were developed with missional communities in mind as their community members reflect upon and share their thoughts in regard to Greg Finke's second missional question: "What is God showing you in His Word?" or Finke's preferred way of expressing the question: "How has God been messing with you?" Read them with your call to mission/witness in mind.

As you reflect upon Finke's question(s) and as you reflect upon the verses being considered, you may find God wanting to comfort you – assure you – empower you – inspire you – convict you – challenge you – teach or instruct you – all of the above – or maybe something else entirely, but be assured God *IS* wanting to speak to you. "He who has ears to hear, let him hear" (Mark 4:9). "Speak Lord, Your servant is listening" (1 Samuel 3:10). "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says" (James 1:22).

As you read the passages ask yourself:

- What do these verses individually and when taken together say or suggest about God's mission and about my/our part in it?
- What is God wanting me/us to hear? What is God wanting me/us to know? What is God wanting me/us to believe? What is God wanting me/us to do?
- In any or all of these passages, what is God saying to me in regard to my missional neighborhood(s)?
- Is there a common denominator/theme? If so, what is it? How do the passages when taken together help us better understand the theme or common denominator?
- What question(s), if any, do these passages raise for me?
- How can/might any or all of these passages help me this week to better live missionally in my missional neighborhood(s) and among anyone and everyone I meet: family, friends, colleagues, neighbors, and even my enemies? How can they help me love my neighbor as Jesus love me and love her/him?



- How has God been "messing" with you, particularly through His Word? What "holy discontent" has the Spirit been generating within you? What does/will it mean for you to be a "doer" of the Word? Are you listening?
- With whom are you having conversation? What relationship(s) in your missional neighborhood are you nurturing through conversation (in a large part means listening "be quick to listen, slow to speak" James 1:19)? How's it going?
- For whom <u>in your missional neighborhood</u> have you recently been a blessing? How? What opportunity do you have to be a blessing (an instrument of God's presence and love – Matthew 10:7-8) for someone in your missional neighborhood? Elaborate and explain.
- o For whom in your missional neighborhood are you praying? For whom in your missional neighborhood would you like us to pray? How can we support you in prayer? How would you like us to pray for you in your life as an everyday missionary? Spend time in prayer.

Dave Luecke:

- What "challenge" has God set before you or is God setting before you? To what degree are you "owning" the challenge? Explain.
- For what "Kingdom Adventure" is God asking/inviting you to "trust" Him and to "join" Him? How's it going???




Bill Cullen's Goals in and for Bible study:

- 5. Participants gain some sort of Biblical knowledge and/or insight.



Disciple, Discipling, & Discipleship Greek Word: μαθητής Transliteration: mathētēs

Learner – Follower by Bill Cullen

At the time of the writing of the New Testament, Rabbis (teachers) had disciples (students/followers). A disciple would not simply learn cognitive information from a Rabbi. A true disciple would learn to do what his or her Rabbi did, sharing the same heart, mind, and attitude of the Rabbi.

Being a disciple of Jesus means more than cognitive agreement with or belief in Jesus. It is more than having affection for Jesus. It is more than being a spectator *watching* Jesus and others in His employ engage the world (all people for whom Jesus came and died -1 Tim 2:4; 1 Jn 2:2). Being a disciple of Jesus is more than being an enthused fan or a cheerleader of Jesus. It involves more than piety, having a virtuously pure lifestyle. Being a disciple of Jesus implies activity on our part. It is more about what we *DO* than it is about what we *DON'T DO* (Jn 13:34-35; Gal 5:6; Jas 4:17).

To be a disciple of Jesus, a true <u>follower</u>, one must actually <u>follow</u>. To be a disciple of Christ one must be learning to do what Jesus does and to actively follow Him as He engages in mission, on the mission field, among the lost, the hurting, and even the rebellious. A true disciple doesn't merely learn "about" Jesus. A true disciple actually <u>DOES</u> mission and ministry <u>WITH</u> and <u>THROUGH</u> Jesus, with the heart, sensitivity, and demeanor of Jesus (*Jn13:34-35; Jn 15:8,12,16-17*).

- + A disciple is one who is learning to do and who <u>does</u> what his/her teacher does with the same heart, mind, and skill as that of the teacher. (*Thankfully Jesus through His Spirit lives in us to live HIS love through us. Jn 15:5; Eph 3:20; Col 1:29*)
- + Jesus when He calls His disciples, He tells them that they will become "fishers of men [women & children]" (Mt 4:19).
- + To be Jesus' disciples is to be *people of mission*: following Jesus onto the mission field and ministering to those He came to seek and to save (*Mt 9:10-13; Lk 19:10*). We are not truly "followers" following Jesus if we are not with *Jesus on the mission field* [be it locally or abroad] doing missional work, be it as an invalid prayer laborer or by rolling up our sleeves for labor.

Jesus tells His disciples that the way people will know that they/we are His disciples is by their/our <u>loving as He loves</u> (Jn 13:34-35; Jn 15:8,12,16-17). Actively loving people is the defining characteristic of a disciple of Jesus (1 Cor 13:13; Gal 5:6).

He loved by dying for sinners.



He loves by coming for and helping/serving the poor, the sick, the hurting, the disenfranchised, the enslaved.

- ♦ As His disciples we are to live lives "worthy of our calling" (Eph 4:1,16; Col 1:10).
- ♦ Washing feet (*Jn 13:12-17*).
- ♦ loving others as He has loved us [sacrificially, unconditionally without limits] (Jn 13:34-35; Mk 10:42-45; Phil 2:3-8; 1 Jn 3:16; 1 Jn 4:11-12).
- ♦ Filled with good works (Mt 5:16; Mt 25:35-40; Eph 2:8-10; 2 Tim 3:15-17; Heb 10:24; 1 Jn 3:17-18).
- ♦ Being kind, tenderhearted and forgiving of all just as He is with us (*Eph 4:32*).
- ♦ Making the most of every opportunity (Eph 5:15-16; Gal 6:2,9-10; Col 4:5; Jas 4:17).
- ♦ Being His witness and giving witness, being ministers of reconciliation (*Acts 1:8; Ro 10:14-15,17; 2 Cor 5:18-20; 1 Jn 1:1-4*).

God's Mission:

Loving, Redeeming, & Restoring the Undeserving that we might live

- joyous, fruitful lives as His sons and daughters and as citizens of His Kingdom
- in love/trust (agape) relationship with our Triune God (Father, Son & Holy Spirit), with all people, and with all that He has created (Ephesians 1:9-10).

There are those in the church (at times perhaps most, if not all, of us), while being well-intended, have misunderstood and misrepresented God's primary mission. There are those in the church that have made God's primary mission to be a mission of morality and moral behavior (gender issues, abortion, hedonism, etc.). – Forgive us, forgive me, Lord!

While it is true God seeks morality and moral behavior in, for, and from His followers, His children, what God seeks most in, for, and from His followers, His children is a healthy, love/trust relationship out which naturally flows Christian (Christlike) morality and moral behavior. When morality and moral behavior become the primary focus, Christianity becomes a religion of law, not a religion of love and healthy relationship.

Our relationship with God does not begin with our morality and moral behavior (by nature [our old Adam] we are immoral sinners – Romans 3:23). However, our relationship with God does result in morality and moral behavior (2 Corinthians 3:18; 1 John 3:1-2). Our relationship with God begins not with us, but with God. In begins with God loving us (the undeserving – Romans 5:7-8; 1 John 4:19). It begins by God making us new creations (Romans 6:3-4,6,11,13; 2 Corinthians 5:17).

God through His Spirit births in us faith in His essence, in His love. He births faith in His love as He extends to us His forgiveness and acceptance made real and tangible in and through Jesus' atoning sacrifice and through His on-going presence with us through His Spirit (1 John 4:7-10).

Experiencing, knowing, and being convinced of His demonstrated love, faith is birthed (Romans 10:17). Knowing God (experiencing His love), we grow to trust in His love, His wisdom, and His power. Trusting in His love, wisdom, and power we seek to live life as He intends, lovingly and morally (1 John 5:3-5). After all, "Father Knows Best!"

Our role in God's mission is to "complete what is lacking in Jesus' affliction" (Colossians 1:24). There was nothing lacking in Jesus affliction in regard to the work of justification (Romans 3:24-25; 1 Timothy 2:3-6; Hebrews 10:10; 1 John 2:2). The work of atonement and justification is complete. What is lacking is in the work of proclamation. That is where we come in (Matthew 10:7-8; Mark 5:19; Acts 1:8; Romans 10:14-17; 2 Corinthians 5:17-21; 1 Peter 3:15; 1 John 1:1-4).

1 John 3:16-18 (NIV) ¹⁶ This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers. ¹⁷ If anyone has material possessions and sees his brother in need but has no pity on him, how can the love of God be in him? ¹⁸ Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.
1 John 4:11-12 (NIV) ¹¹ Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. ¹² No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.
Our Empowerment
We can because Jesus can and Jesus lives in us to do through us.
Jesus does not ask us to live our lives <i>for</i> Him, rather He seeks to live His life <i>through</i> us. When the Holy Spirit births faith in us the Spirit is in fact birthing Jesus in us (2 Corinthians 5:17; Galatians 2:20; Galatians 3:27) with all the power of His divine nature (Ephesians 3:20; 2 Peter 1:3-4). But just as a human baby is not developed and its muscle and mental faculties are undeveloped so is the Christ in us undeveloped in us. As the Spirit works in us to bring us to greater maturity, the Jesus in us becomes more fully formed (Galatians 4:19). As Jesus increasingly is formed in we are increasingly transformed in His image (2 Corinthians 3:18; 1 John 3:1-2) bearing the fruit of His indwelling presence and character (John 15:4-5; Galatians 5:22-23). We do not <i>work for</i> our salvation. It is a gift we already have (Ephesians 2:8-9), but we do or ought to <i>work out</i> /live out the salvation we have as Jesus work in and through us to accomplish His good and loving purposes (Philippians 2:12-13), bearing the fruit of His presence and character (Colossians 1:28-29).
John 15:4-5 (NIV) ⁴ Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. ⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.
$_$ Acts 1:8 (NIV) 8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."
2 Corinthians 3:4-6 (NIV) ⁴ Such confidence as this is ours through Christ before God. ⁵ Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God. ⁶ He has made us competent as ministers of a new covenantnot of the letter but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.
2 Corinthians 3:18 (NIV) ¹⁸ And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.
2 Corinthians 5:17 (NIV) ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!
Galatians 2:20 (NIV) ²⁰ I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.
Galatians 3:27 (NIV) 27 for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.
Galatians 4:19 (NIV) 19 My dear children, for whom I am again in the pains of childbirth until Christ is formed in you,
Galatians 5:22-23 (NIV) ²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control
Ephesians 2:8-9 (NIV) ⁸ For it is by grace you have been saved, through faithand this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God ⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast.

2 Peter 1:3-4 (NIV) ³ His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness. ⁴ Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature and escape the corruption in the world caused by evil desires.
1 John 3:1-2 (NIV) ¹ How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! ² Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when he appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.
