

CONNECTING IDENTITY & CALLING

IDENTITY: WHO AM I?

God raised Jesus from the dead; in Christ, I will be raised from the dead on the Last Day.

CALLING: WHY AM I HERE?

I am called to rejoice in the eternal life that I have and to tell others of Jesus, who rescues from sin, death, and hell.

GROWING IN FAITH FOR LIFE

See how this lesson builds on learning for each age.

ADULT

I can consider what the specific events of the resurrection mean for God's people both in the narrative and today.

YOUTH

I can confess the truth that Jesus died and rose from the dead, conquering sin and death to give me and all believers eternal life.

ELEMENTARY

I understand Jesus conquered death and rose from the dead, giving me eternal life in Him.

EARLY CHILDHOOD

I know Jesus came alive again on Easter and gives me life with Him forever.

BIBLE VERSE

The Lord has risen!

Luke 24:34

SCRIPTURE SNAPSHOT

The women who witness Christ's burial are the first to witness His resurrection. With great joy, they run to tell His disciples that Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

TAKING IT HOME

- ▶ *On the Go*—When springtime comes, many new flowers sprout from the ground after being dead through the winter. Compare these sprouting seeds to Jesus' resurrection.
- ▶ *At Mealttime*—On Good Friday, there was an earthquake (Matthew 27:51–52). On Easter morning, another earthquake happened (Matthew 28:2). What did each earthquake do?
- ▶ *Something to Do*—Sing your favorite Easter hymns. Accompany them by shaking plastic eggs filled with dry rice.
- ▶ *Before Bed*—Pray together that God would give you hope and joy in His resurrection and the empty tomb.
