


A Note From Pastor Lauren

SABBATICAL INFORMATION

July 1 - September 30, 2023



After serving us for six-years, our pastor Rev. Lauren Ostrout will be taking a 3-month Sabbatical. Therefore, your Pastor-Parish Relations Team (Barb Bosse, Kurt Frantzen, Denise Turner, & Donna Wink) prepared this brochure for the greater-CFC community to share information about sabbaticals and our role during her absence.

What Is A Sabbatical?

Sabbatical as a word comes from the biblical concept of Sabbath, that is, setting aside time that God consecrates and makes holy. Such leave provides time for pastors to disengage, rest, study, reflect, and/or travel to reinvigorate, refresh, and renew their body, mind, and spirit. A critical aspect of a sabbatical is Respect. Grant Pastor Lauren and her family space and privacy and do not contact them via phone, email, or other communication venues.

While this time is a sabbatical for our called Pastor, it remains a **Season of Growth** for the congregation.

During this time, all church business will be handled by the Office and the Rev. Jack M. Shackles, Jr., our Interim Sabbatical Pastor-

Pastor Jack began his ministry in the Southern Baptist Church. After 20 years of active duty (including enlisted U.S. Army crypto-linguist during the Viet Nam conflict.) and reserve duty, he retired a Lieutenant Commander in 1991 from the Chaplain Corps (U.S. Navy Reserves). He continued pastoral work in 1994 with the United Church of Christ. Over many years, he has served the UCC New London Association in various capacities including being the Chair of Committee on Ministry. After serving as pastor of the Taftville Congregational Church for 15 years, he retired as a UCC minister in 2022. When he leaves CFC this October, he will celebrate 50 years of ordination!!

- "Meals in a can", canned pastas, individual mac & cheese, soups, shelfstable protein shakes, etc. (to be brought home)



FUNDRAISER NOTES

Thank you so very much for volunteering to head up a Fundraiser. Your willingness to put in your time and efforts on behalf of CFC are certainly appreciated! A few helpful hints.

- 1. Notify the Office, cfc06415@gmail.com of the proposed date as soon as you have settled on one. It is essential that we have one central clearing for event dates.
- 2. **Resources:** The list of persons who have agreed to be contacted for fundraisers is at the Office. Nicole is your greatest resource and can advise you as to such things as building use regulations, publicity and many other details. The Ministry of Stewardship is also there as a resource: Chair is Mark Bosse.
- 3. **Publicity:** Your go-to is the RiverEast. The weekly deadline is Tuesday at noon. Request that they print your piece as a separate article and not include it in the CFC announcements — it will get more attention that way. Nicole is the administrator of our Facebook page and can advise you on other social media. As well, she has software to produce some very nice posters. Many local businesses, such as Noel's, have places where one can post flyers for an event.
- 4. Advance Funds: If you need "seed money" for supplies for your fundraiser, please contact Tom St. Louis, tstlouis06415@gmail.com. The Congregation has also been very generous in donating supplies for fundraisers.
- 5. Kitchen use must be supervised by one of four persons in the Church who have obtained "ServSafe" certification. Nicole can put you in touch.
- 6. Door Prizes must be conducted and concluded entirely in the duration of the event. Local businesses will sometimes donate; for instance, we have received a gift certificate from the Inishmor in the past.
- 7. **Set-up.** If you need tables and chairs set up, Dave Hock can do so with enough advance notice. It is essential however that you draw up for him a plan of how you would like the tables and chairs positioned; Dave's mailbox is in the Office. Breakdown of the tables and chairs after the event is the responsibility of those holding the event.
- 8. Cash Boxes. CFC has cash boxes available. Please remember to have enough cash on hand if you will be making change for items sold.
- 9. **Follow-up.** Check everything twice when you're locking up; some of the doors have tricky locks. Moneys go to Tom St. Louis for deposit. And all who work on fundraisers love to be acknowledged; a note in the Crier or in Thursday Thoughts will be much appreciated.

It is volunteers such as you that help make CFC the wonderful community it is. Thank you, thank you, thank you!!!
